## When will we lose this eyesore?

It has been 14 years since Rose & Young vacated their premises at No. 67 Croydon Road, Caterham Valley, and moved to Redhill in 1994 and the building has remained empty ever since. Residents and traders have been making it clear they do not want to spend the next 14 years living in the shadow of what has become Caterham's most hated evesore. Over the years, various planning applications have been submitted by the owner to Tandridge District Council for redevelopment of the site. There the process mysteriously grinds

#### Kenley Airfield to remain unfenced

The Ministry of Defence (MoD) has withdrawn its appeal against refusal of planning permission by Croydon Borough and Tandridge District Councils for the erection of a four foot high metal fence around the perimeter track of Kenley Airfield. Instead, the MoD is working with officers from the two local authorities, the City of London (which manages Kenley Common), Surrey Hills Gliding Club and others to help improve public access and safety at the Airfield. Hilary Turner, District and

Parish Councillor for Portley Caterham, said: Ward, "This is very welcome news and is a tribute to those who organised the two petitions against the fence and to over 800 people who signed them. Sometimes public action does have a real impact.

"I am also very pleased that the MoD, Air Cadets, Gliding Club and local authorities are now working together to ensure the continued safety of gliding and public use while maintaining access around the Airfield perimeter. I urge all those who visit the Airfield to keep to the public areas and follow safety advice."

#### Surrey working on new 'Community Hub'

July will see the one-year anniversary of the closure of the Adult Education Centre in Caterham Valley, leaving many local residents angry and upset at the loss of the facility. 'Surplus to requirement' assets such as these are being sold across the county to help make up the huge shortfall in government subsidies for Surrey. The popular community centre in the old drill hall in Godstone Road was another asset sold by Surrey County Council. But will the money raised from the sales be reinvested in Caterham, a growing town that needs a new youth facility, amongst other things? Surrev County Councillor for Caterham Valley, Cllr. Sally Marks, gave us an update


on the situation: "The good news is that there seems to be much more understanding that some of the proceeds at least will be reinvested into this town," she said. "There is a lot of work currently going on at the Council to do with a business case for a new 'community hub' and I am very pleased at what has been decided so far - it will tick a lot of boxes. The Youth Development Service is identifying the needs of the youth of Caterham and it is recognised and still on the plan that Caterham will get a youth facility. In the meantime, I am pleased to say that the Baptist Church users are now able to use the car park at the old Adult Education Centre.

#### Shelley's Music and Movement

Personal Trainer, Shelley Baker, is using her skills to bring music and movement to the elderly residents of local old people's homes. "It all started when my nan came to live with us when she was unwell," explained Shelley. "I went through some gentle exercises to music with her to lift her spirits and she really enjoyed it. Shelley's classes start with a halfhour warm-up followed by exercises using resistance bands to increase muscle strength and tennis balls to improve hand-eye co-ordination. Her classes have proved to be a hit with the residents who say she has brought the spark back into their lives! 

#### Recognising sporting excellence

On Wednesday, 2nd April, Caterham Rotary launched its new 'Sporting Excellence Award' by presenting a cheque for £250 to local athlete, 19 year old Hannah Brooks. The presentation took place at Oxted Secondary School where Hannah attended before going to Birmingham University to study Psychology. Hannah, whose home is in Caterham Valley, is one of the top middle distance runners in Europe for her age group and is aiming to be a gold medal winner at the London 2012 or 2016 Olympics.

At the presentation ceremony, Rotarian Mike Dalton, said: "We are here to award Hannah with the first ever Sporting Award for Excellence from Caterham Rotary Club. We wanted to recognise youngsters in all areas of sport and Hannah is a very deserving recipient of the first award. We want it to become an established part of the relationship between the Rotary Club and schools, and we thought this auspicious occasion would be a very good way to kick off the award."

Mr Adrian Bennett, Head of Sixth Form at Oxted School, said: "We are extremely proud of Hannah who has been a great inspiration for our pupils. Despite the hours spent rigorously training at the track, Hannah never once detracted from her studies and achieved excellence in her academic studies as well as in sport. We are delighted that Caterham Rotary are supporting her in this way and that the first ever Award is taking place at Oxted School."

Hannah is being mentored by Dame Kelly Holmes who is helping talented young female middle distance athletes to achieve their dreams through 'On Camp with Kelly', an initiative sponsored and supported by Norwich Union. Dame

vision was OCWK should be an educational development programme so that the athletes who are part of it gain life experiences as well as learn what it takes to become a class athlete. Through OCWK, Hannah has attended training camps in Loughborough University, travelled to the Commonwealth Games in Australia and raced in international meetings across the UK and Furone.

OCWK has been fantastic because teaches us that being a world class athlete isn't just about physical training, it's about the

whole person - taking care of ourselves properly and developing the personal qualities we need to stick to our goals, whatever challenges and obstacles might get in our way," explained Hannah. "It was a real thrill to go to the Commonwealth Games, although I wanted to be on the track rather

than a spectator!"

Training to become a worldclass athlete involves a lot of expense, however. The cost of travelling to sporting venues, accommodation and having to buy new trainers every three months can add up to a tidy sum. "I try to save where I can, for example I don't bother spending money on designer running shirts - it's more important to invest in the correct footwear," explained Hannah.

On receiving the cheque, Hannah said: "Thank you so much. I'm really grateful to the Rotary Club for this award - you have no idea how much it will help! I'm very honoured to be the first person to be given the award.'

The Caterham Independent will be following Hannah's progress as she follows her dream to be on the podium with her gold medal one day! Later this year Caterham Rotary will be sending out packs to local schools inviting them to nominate candidates for the 2009 award.

#### Burtenshaw's **Beat**

Some of you may have seen recent newspaper articles highlighting isolated pockets of anti-social behaviour or criminal damage in Caterham.

Although residents and business owners in the town centre and Caterham-onthe-Hill have suffered from some youth related crime and disorder recently the problem is not rife as you were led to believe.

Those of you who live or work in Caterham will know that officers from my Safer Neighbourhood Team reqularly patrol areas where we know youngsters congregate and we are working hard to ensure the community is



safe and feels safe.

But tackling anti-social behaviour is not an issue Surrey Police can tackle alone. As I discussed last month we work closely with Tandridge District Council, Surrey County Council, Guinness Trust, housing associations, Youth Service and other agencies in order to establish long-term solutions to these neighbourhood concerns. We also encourage the community to take an active interest in their area because with everyone working towards one goal it will mean we can achieve a lot more for the well-being of the community.

There are also a lot of meas-

ures in place to combat antibehaviour in and social around the town centre that for obvious reasons we do not always make public. However, I can personally assure you that my officers are working extremely hard behind the scenes to crack down on anti-social behaviour.

Youth related crime and disorder is not something Surrey Police takes lightly and we would encourage anyone who has been a victim of anti-social behaviour to report it to the police immediately.

Sightings of the A22 'ghost' reappeared along the Caterham Bypass recently spooking a motorist. The figure, which appears to be of a woman in a distressed state, crosses the road in front of motorists and then disappears up a flight of stairs into a wooded area. These sightings have been reported going back many years and I myself attended one such incident in 2006. Although I am aware there is some debate over who, or what, the figure is we at Surrey Police are keeping an open mind about the sightinas.

#### Strange but true!

If you go down to Caterham Valley Computers today you're sure of a big surprise! Common sense will tell you that it can't be true but there you will see a fully working computer submerged in an aquarium. The wireless keyboard is the only component outside the aquarium, which is a particular favourite with young children who can see that it should not work. It was created as a shop fitting and it is the first time a whole PC including screen and boot/storage media has been successfully

submerged.

Brad King, owner of the Godstone Road shop, said: "We got the idea on the coach on the way to our Christmas Party. We were discussing a similar project in another country that hadn't quite succeeded and decided to give it a go." The  $\,$ aquarium pc cost about £800 to build and Trust, the pan-European computer components and peripherals manufacturer, tributed a few hundred pounds towards the cost. #### Council awarded £10 million for affordable housing

Affordable housing in Tandridge received a massive boost last week, with the award of £7.4 million over the next three years from the Housing Corporation, which will lead to the creation of 195 new affordable homes in the district.

In addition, £2.5 million has been allocated for this current financial year, providing another 45 homes.

Affordable housing is one of Tandridge's top priorities and the Council has been working hard with its housing association partners to draw up a number of bids affordable housing schemes in the district.

The Council will now work closely with these associations to provide the district with high quality homes, for rent or purchase, at a reasonable cost. Tandridge has a target of delivering a minimum of 40 new affordable homes per year. This funding will ensure the Council achieves in excess of this target.

The award will fund two schemes in Caterham: Eight self-contained one-bedroom units for a mix of moderate to high dependency adults with learning/physical disabilities in Whyteleafe Road and refurbishment to existing homes owned by the Le Personne Benevolent Trust provide ten self-contained homes for elderly women at the Homes in Banstead Road.

More funding may be allocated to Tandridge over the next three years, as for the first time housing associations can bid for more money when new housing schemes are developed.

## The finches in my garden

I've been waiting all winter for a small bird with a dark head and pale orange chest to visit the garden. Bramblings are my favourite of the eight species of finch that I've seen in Chaldon, but also the most unpredictable. They nest in Norway and elsewhere in the north; come winter, they move erratically southwards, and, according to the BTO, birds that migrate to Britain one year might be recorded in Italy during the next. They are certainly not lost for avian company here, although the large flocks of chaffinches and yellowhammers that have carpeted the garden for the last couple of months are starting to fracture as territorial urges return with the onset of the breeding season. Other species are actively constructing their nests. I have recently seen a female greenfinch jamming her bill full of soft winter fur shed by the Old Dogfox in his wanderings around the garden, and exquisitely marked goldfinches are gathering twigs.

Bullfinches are rather shyer, but the male with his bright pink chest is amongst our brightest small birds, although his white rump as he flies



away is sometimes more familiar! They come principally to drink from the pond, unlike their relatives, who consume all the birdseed that they can find, both on the ground and from the feeders. I had rather expected pretty little siskins - an-other migrant - to be among the feeding hoardes, but none have visited the garden this year.

And the bramblings? As irony would have it, I saw this symbol of winter migration for the first time this season on 19th March, which happened to be the same day I saw my first bluebells of the spring! We are truly at a junction of the seasons.

In an effort to reduce the damaging effect the derelict site has on its neighbours, the Council has prosecuted the owner in the past for not keeping the site neat and tidy. Consequently, the owner now sees to it that the weeds are periodically removed from the brickwork and rubbish is cleared from the forecourt but this is small comfort to the local community who would far rather see the sight completely redeveloped. Chairman of the ABC Better Caterham' Healthcheck, Chris Windridge, has been overseeing the analysis of the results of the recent Caterham-wide survey. "In the ABC survey 85% of the respondents demanded action on the Rose & Young site." said Chris. "It Young site," said Chris. has been a blight on the shopping area of the town for long enough and it is time for the developers and the council to come up with a scheme for the site.'

Stephen Weigel, Chief Executive of Tandridge District

Council, told The Caterham Independent: "Caterham Town Centre is on our Council's programme of priorities - it is one of our Council Key Objectives. The Local Strategic Partnership (LSP) with representatives from Tandridge District Council, Surrey County Council, Parish Councils, Business, Police, Health, LA21 and Tandridge Leisure has a Community Strategy that includes Caterham Town Centre as one of the four key District priori-The Caterham Town ties. Centre Working Group recently met and agreed to explore the opportunity of bringing together a consortium of consultants that have different areas of expertise with regard to the future of the Town Centre."

"The Independent ABC Healthcheck has been really helpful in that it will be submitting a bid to the South East of England Development Agency (SEEDA) to secure funds for the Town, and acquiring that money will potentially unlock further money from central government and other sources that is why the community



survey has been so valuable and helpful to the LSP and ABC Group. In the meantime, we are seeking to ensure that this work is progressed including examination of the potential of Caterham sites including the Rose & Young site and when approached by the owner have been encouraging him to come forward with proposals.'

The recent Caterham ABC 'A Better Caterham' Healthcheck was also commended by Mr Ainsworth: "The ABC Healthcheck has produced really good results," he said. "ABC has been the first hoop to go through to get additional funding and this process is now happening. Tandridge District Council can only implement a compulsory purchase order as part of a wider scheme. They

have to apply to the Regional Development Agency for funding and anything to do with a government department takes a long time." Tony Jones of Anthony Jones Photographers in Croydon Road expressed his frustration at the lack of progress after so many years - a mood shared by many other traders in Caterham Valley: "I think it is disgusting that after 14 years Caterham is still saddled with a major eyesore because greedy investors have no thought for the community in which they work and maybe even live. It's as if the local council and other stakeholders have no will to do anything about it."

The owner of the site, was unavailable for comment.

Mr Peter Ainsworth MP has promised to write to the owner of the Rose & Young site to ask him what proposals he has for relieving Caterham of this eyesore.

#### In the garden

by Alec Herbert

As the days become warmer and longer, the spring flowers and bulbs will begin to fade and thoughts will turn to what is necessary to produce a blaze of colour in the coming months. There will be pots and containers to fill or refill, as well as gaps in beds and borders where weeds or plants have been removed. For many, the replacement of the spring bulbs and other flowering plants such as heathers is the easiest decision of the year. Simply stick to the traditional summer flower plants such as geraniums, fuchsia, petunia, impatiens (busy lizzies) etc.

These are all fine but a word of warning especially if you are not growing your own plants from cuttings or seeds. All the garden centres now have excellent selections of young plants but they will be displayed indoors mostly, with the warning 'protect from frost'. This is most important and whilst buying young plants and growing them on yourself

will reduce the costs of purchasing larger plants in a few weeks time, do not be tempted to plant straight into that empty tub on the patio. Put the young plants into the greenhouse or a frost free area and water regularly in small quantities. Allow the plants to acclimatize to outside temperatures by bringing outside in the day time and leave out over night when there is no danger of a ground frost. This process is known as hardening off and should promote a healthy and sturdy growth once the plants are planted

in their permanent position. As well as the usual summer annuals, why not consider perennials for both container and bedding? If these are purchased as young plants, they may be more expensive initially but as most will flower for several years, long term, they will provide excellent value and reduce the work load. Perennials not only provide a range of colours but many will give an appearance of attractive foliage all year I will outline some of the hundreds of varieties of plants available in next month's article.

The answer to the question that people keep asking me is 'yes, I will still be involved in Scouting, but I don't know what role my new DC has earmarked for me'. Watch this space.






