Rose & Young the parasite in our midst (cont. from p1)

With local businesses struggling to find the thousands of pounds required to pay annual business rates, many wonder what the money is used for, as they have to pay private contractors to remove their rubbish and very little seems to be being invested in the economic welfare of Caterham.

To make matters worse, it was revealed at a recent meeting of the Caterham Valley Business Partnership that the owners of 67-69 Croydon Road ('the Rose & Young site') are not eligible to pay business rates because according to governlegislation, ment the property is 'Not capable of beneficial occupation'.

Andrew Browne, Chairman of the Caterham Valley Business Forum, said: "We think it is incredible that the owners of this enormous site are not paying business rates If they like the rest of us. had to pay, the owners might demolish the site to avoid paying business rates. It wouldn't be ideal, but it

would be a step in the right direction. It is just awful. I think it is appalling.'

Tony Jones, of Anthony Jones Photography in Croydon Road angrily commented: "Whichever way you look at it, it is just a disgrace which is a big blight on the town. There seems to be nothing available in law to stop a consortium of businessmen, through hampering greed, the prospects of a town like Caterham. There should be a way of putting the premises up for tender if they are left standing unused for a certain number of years, to the detriment of the local economy."

A Valuation Office Agency spokesman said: "The property was removed from the rating list in September 1997 because, taking into consideration the property's age and condition, it was the opinion of the Valuation Officer that no one would be prepared to pay a rent for

the property as it stood. As defined in rating legislation, this means it does not warrant an entry in the rating list, and as a consequence it attracts no rating liability." On hearing the news East

Surrey MP, Peter Ainsworth, said: "I think it is shocking. I had thought that the whole point of the new legislation is that empty properties such as these would become liable to pay full business rates. I think it is appalling that the owner of this site does not have to pay anything, at the cost of local business owners."

Mr Ainsworth wrote to the Chief Executive of Tandridge District Council, Stephen Weigel, recently about the lack of progress in redeveloping the former site, and why the Council is not pursuing a Compulsory Purchase Order (CPO) on the grounds that it is detrimental to the economic welfare of the town. In his reply, Mr "The fact Weigel stated:

that the site remains neglected is a source of intense frustration to all of us trying to improve Caterham. However, the District Council is limited in what it can do to compel the private owners of redundant properties, such as the Rose & Young site, to actually implement approved schemes if they decide for their own reasons not to do so \ldots . The general principle of a CPO is that there must be a compelling case in the public interest to go down this route. Any authority pursuing a CPO should be sure that the purposes for which it is making an Order sufficiently justifies interfering with the human rights of those with any interest in the land affected." He went on to say: "I believe it is unlikely the Council could commit to a CPO without a private developer partner with a worked up scheme and finance

place.' Mr Ainsworth told us: think the best way forward is for continued dialogue between the County and District Council to work towards a solution, in addition to continued pressure on the owners of the site."



I often talk about the importance of making your valuable belongings secure. Well, thankfully for one victim they did just that! Last month officers arrested a man in Caterham, in the early hours of the morning, with a laptop and ipod in his possession he couldn't account for. A few simple checks revealed the items were security marked and had been stolen from a vehicle. The suspect, 27-yearold Aaron Bashford from Caterham, was arrested. He pleaded guilty at court to theft and we were able to reunite the victim with his valuables.

Free crime prevention advice is always available from my crime reduction officer PC John Lee or alternatively log on to the Surrey Police website www.surrey.police.uk for some top tips on reducing your chance of becoming a victim of crime.

This month I am sending a strong message to all Tandridge residents, including youngsters, parents and carers, that anti-social behaviour in the run-up to Halloween and Bonfire Night simply will not be tolerated. The Tandridge Safer Neighbourhood Team is



taking a zero-tolerance approach towards the increase in criminal damage and anti-social behaviour that can be associated with these events. We will be laying-on extra patrols in known hot-spot areas to deal with any criminal activity and also to reassure members of the community that Surrey Police will robustly deal with those who commit offences. I am asking parents to be responsible and play your part during this time. You should know where your children are going to be on Halloween and ensure they respect the wishes of those who display a 'No Trick or Treat' sticker. Also retailers should be alert for young people buying eggs and flour as a minority of young people think trick or treating is a good excuse for throwing these items at unsuspecting victims.

The Horseshoe at Warlingham Green recently extended its Sunday carvery to seven days a week, a move that has proved extremely popular with diners. There is still the regular menu of fish, meat and vegetarian choices where the quality of the food has clearly not been compromised by this change. On a recent visit my dining partner and I were taken through the smart and spacious restaurant to a table by the window. We found that despite it being a busy Friday night, we didn't feel crowded as the tables are positioned so that you're not seated cheek-by-jowl with the other diners.

The food was superb. The meals are all prepared from fresh ingredients by the restaurant's new Head Chef, Wendy Butler. For starters I had succulent 'Fried Squid in Crispy Iceberg Lettuce with Lemon Mayonnaise', while my partner enjoyed 'Mushrooms in Garlic Cream and

Toast'. The 'toast' turned out to be toasted French bread smothered with a generous helping of mushrooms in a dreamy garlic sauce. For our main course, my partner opted for the 10oz Sirloin Steak from the selection of meat dishes. The steak was served with a Madeira and mushroom sauce with chips and vegetables and in his words, was 'absolutely perfect, lovely and tender!' decided to try the carvery that was offering beef, turkey and gammon. So, of course, I had to try some of each and returned to my table with my plate piled high with meat, Yorkshires and plenty of roasties and other vegetables. It was all delicious and I was particularly impressed by how fresh and crisp the vegetables were, not at all mushy as you so often find with vegetables served alongside a

In the garden

by Alec Herbert

Autumn may well be the season of mists and mellow fruitfulness but it is a busy time for gardeners wishing to have the garden looking good before the advent of

As the growth rate of the grass slows, the frequency of mowing can be reduced. If time can be found, rake out the thatch, aerate to improve drainage and give the lawn an autumn feed.

Perennials can be divided by lifting and dividing older clumps, particularly those of a summer flowering habit such as peonies, hellebores, polyanthus or heuchera. Lift out the plant in its entirety with a garden fork and divide using a knife or spade or even simply pulling apart. If part of the clump is to be replanted in the same place, improve the soil by digging in organic matter and add a suitable fertilizer. Try to ensure that each clump has a number of healthy shoots on it and do not allow the exposed roots to dry out before replanting. Water it well, even if it rains - which it probably will!!

As summer bedding plants are removed from both borders and containers, bulb planting should now be in full swing. Snowdrops, followed by crocuses, followed by daffodils, followed by tulips will provide more than a splash of colour from the end of January through to the end of April. Winter flowering heathers, primulas, pansies, chrysanthemums, etc will provide colour during the dark winter months.

There is something very satisfying about plants you have raised yourself and one way to provide a few extra plants free of charge is to utilise those that grow in unwanted places. Flowers such as viola, primrose, ground cover geraniums, ajuga and aquilegia have a habit of self seeding in path cracks and shingle or gravel drives. Instead of pulling them out and composting, ease them out and put them into a tray of damp compost. This will, in all probability, result in strong healthy plants next spring and if they all fail (very unlikely) the only cost is a handful of compost. Happy Gardening.



even exchanges of possession followed with two missed attempts by the visitors who converted a fourth awarded penalty just before half time making the score 7 - 6.




