Funds have now been made available through the Youth Opportunities Fund to create the new centre in the premises previously occupied by Caterham Litho in Caterham Valley.

If you try to impose things on youngsters they simply don't want to know - it's important to encourage them to take an interest." The pupils are launching a logo and naming competition for the new centre which is open to all youngsters in Tandridge. Roadworks to return to Church Hill after Easter

The work being carried out to replace the gas mains on Church Hill which caused so much disruption before Christmas, is set to resume after Faster.

The works were temporarily halted last year to enable shoppers to have easier access to Caterham Vally, thus not adversely affecting Christmas trade. A spokesperson from Surrey Highways said: "The gas works will continue from 14th April so that there is no disruption over the Easter weekend.

Southern Gas anticipate the works to be complete by the end of April.

"The gas works taken this length of time because of the worked involved in excavating and reinstating the surface of such a long hill."

Southern Gas also explained that there will be a few days when the site is open but no works are underway. This will be to enable the concrete to set sufficiently before the re-opening of the road.

New technology for the Dene

Patients at the Caterham Dene Hospital in Caterham-on-the-Hill are benefitting from a brand new Full Blood Count Analyser thanks to the fundraising efforts of the Caterham Dene League of Friends and Caterham Rotary and Round Table clubs. The £6,000 machine tests blood for high white blood cells which can indicate

conditions such as anaemia, blood loss and clotting.

Nurse Paula Matthews, said: "It is really a natty machine, very high tech but low maintenance. Normally the blood would have to go to East Surrey Hospital and we would have to wait 24 hours for the results.

"It really impacts on patient care in a positive way because we now get the results within a few minutes."

During the students' visit, Mark together with Linda Smith of Kestrels Children's Centre gave a









In the garden

by Alec Herbert

Climbing roses can make a spectacular and fragrant contribution to any garden. Few, if any, climbers can flower so profusely in such a wide range of colours. Because they take up only a small area of ground, they are perfect for small gardens and they can cover a large vertical area, providing camouflage for an unsightly garden wall or fence panel.

Many climbing roses will bloom over a long period and are likely to repeat flower from early summer through to late autumn.

Early spring is a good time for planting as the soil begins to warm up and climbing roses will grow in most soils. Like all roses, they will benefit from the addition of organic matter before planting but that statement must carry a word of warning. Do not apply a forkful of fresh farmyard manure as this is likely to burn the roots of the rose. Ensure any organic material is well rotted down and plant with a handful of fertilizer in the bottom of the hole. When filling in the hole, try to ensure there are no air pockets among the roots.

Pruning and training a

climbing rose is simple but can be time consuming and prickly! Most climbing roses do best if trained as horizontally as possible and flowers will normally appear on the side of growths. Try to encourage the long stems to break into new shoots at each node. The choice of climbing roses is extensive and most have been bred to resemble Floribundas or Hybrid Tea roses with all the virtues of those roses, plus the extra vigour required of a climber. Colours include deep reds, delicate pinks, yellows and white with many different varieties available.

Selecting the rose to meet your own requirements can be an enjoyable experience in itself. Once established. the occasional feed and correct pest control will bring its own benefits and many will flower for several years with minimal pruning. If then, you are fed up of looking at a bare garden wall or fence panel, now is the time to do something about it. Happy gardening.

Burtenshaw's Beat

I am often asked: "Are there any police officers based at Caterham Police Station?" The answer is yes. Neighbourhood Inspector for Tandridge, I am based at Caterham and have a large number of officers who work with me. These include Sergeant Dan Gutierez, Community Safety Sergeant, with his team of three police officers who are responsible Youth Intervention, for Crime Prevention and Casualty Reduction, together with one Youth Police Community Support Officer (YPCSO). Also working at Caterham is Sergeant Jane Pettett, with her team of 13 Neighbourhood Support Officers (NSOs) and Police Community Support Officers (PCSOs). Together they cover the areas of Caterham Valley, Caterham-on-the-Hill, Warlingham East and Warlingham West.

At Lingfield Police Station, Sergeant Mike Simmonds, Tandridge's other Neighbourhood Sergeant, leads a team of six NSOs and PCSOs. They cover the areas of Lingfield, Smallfield and Bletchingley. The




remaining seven NSOs and PCSOs, also led by Sergeant Simmonds, are based at Oxted Police Station, covering Oxted, Hurst Green, Godstone and Blindley Heath. The entire neighbourhood team is supported by three Neighbourhood Coordinators and an administrator.

The team is supported in the policing of Tandridge by other departments. These include the Targeted Patrol Team (TPT), which is the response team based at Reigate. These officers work shifts over a 24 hour period, seven days a week, and a number from each shift predominantly cover Tandridge, ensuring local knowledge and close liaison with the neighbourhood team. Operational support including roads policing, the dogs unit and the helicopter give the area access to an additional uniformed presence. I hope this reassures you that your neighbourhood team is locally based and working closely with the community to target local concerns.

Today there is nothing surprising about a woman running her own successful business, but it is still unusual to see a woman working in the funeral trade. For local businesswoman, Diane Pink, running her funeral business has been the most rewarding role of her life.

When she left school, Diane wanted to be a nurse. "My dad didn't like the idea at all," said Diane. "He persuaded me to train as a hairdresser and I ended up running a barbers shop in Cannon Street. I eventually trained as a nurse when I was 24, but after getting a job at Mayday Hospital I injured my back, so I retrained to become a dental nurse. After a few years I felt ready for a career change and answered an advert for a receptionist at a funeral directors but when I got the job it turned out that what they really wanted was a trainee funeral director! I trained as a funeral arranger to begin with then went on to become a funeral director."

Diane went into partnership and launched her business eight years ago. She now has two branches of Pinks Funeral Directors, one in Caterham and one in Hamsey Green.

"The amount of job satisfaction is enormous," explained Diane. "We are dealing with people at their most vulnerable and if I can achieve a funeral that is just right for the client then I feel we have done a good job.

"The downside of the job is not being able to take the pain away. One thing I have done is set up a bereavement support group because I felt it was important to offer continued

support. We don't like to say goodbye straight after the funeral.


