Locals rally to re-open The ARC

A public meeting was held last month to launch a Com munity Share Issue to raise £100,000 to refurbish The ARC. The popular arts and recreational centre in Caterham was closed last March, but it is hoped to get the facility functioning again with help from local residents. Around 60 people attended the meeting that was led by Dick Moran, the Chairman of the Caterham Barracks Trust that owns the building. During the evening Dick set out his vision for the future of The ARC which will include

a children's soft play area, creative arts facility and coffee bar. Since the launch over £1,000 in shares have been bought and many volunteers have come forward to offer manpower and expertise to clean, refurbish and manage the building. The new Tandridge Community Fund ('TCF') received a generous boost to its funds recently during an informal function hosted by Surrey County Councillor for Caterham Valley, Sally Marks. Founder members of TCF including Chairman, Mike Moss, took the opportunty to explain to their special guests the significance of the new local fund and the enormous potential it has to assist local groups and individuals in need of financial support. The guest speaker was Dr Helen Bowcock, author of 'Hidden Surrey', a report that explains in detail why 'local giving' is needed to strengthen our communities. TCF is administered by the Community Foundation for Surrey which awards grants across the county. . TCF's initial target is to raise a £100,000 capital fund in order to be in a position to start awarding grants in Tandridge and the fund already has nearly £40,000. Thanks to the government's 'Grassroots' initiative, any

£1 donation made before March 2011 is matched with a further £1 from the Office of the Third Sector's Grassroots programme and with Gift Aid the donation more than doubles, pushing a £1 donation up to the sum of £2.56 for the Fund.

After the event, TCF Chairman Mike Moss said: "I am very grateful to Sally Marks for hosting this event and for the support and generosity shown by those who attended. Our fund is steadily growing and we are especially keen to take advantage of the government's match-funding while it is available. This is an especially good time for donors who can see their donation more than doubled if they want to help us now. Firstly I want to say a big thank you to everyone who responded to our message: 'Don't wind up with egg on your face' regarding how we would deal with anti-social behaviour around Halloween and Guy Fawkes Night. The number of reports of ASB over this period was the quietest in years. On Halloween night we seized a quantity of alcohol from underage teenagers. We also issued two fixed penalty notices; one for obtaining alcohol for someone under the age of 18 and the other to a convenience store for selling wine and cigarettes to three 15-year-old girls.

On Remembrance Sunday members of my team were at locations throughout Tandridge assisting with traffic control and laying



wreaths. I was at Warlingham and it was warming to see so many of the community out there particularly the young people paying their respects.

In November we held a meeting for Neighbourhood Watch Coordinators which was attended by many. The meeting was opened by District Chairman Cllr Glynis Whittle. Presentations were given by our Force Crime Prevention Officer, myself and coordinator of Woldingham NHW (900 houses covered). It was a positive meeting, the outcome being that we want NHW

to grow in Tandridge, so please contact us and we can maybe link you to an established scheme.

Contrary to reports you may have read regarding an incident outside the Royal British Legion in May I would like to clarify that officers were initially called to a report of people throwing stones and bottles but the situation soon escalated into violent public disorder. Two people are currently on trial for assaulting police officers in connection with this incident and it would be inappropriate to comment further at this stage.

Recently I attended two meetings which discussed next years Caterham festival and 'De-Fest'. It is exciting to see the plans coming together for what should be excellent community events with something for everyone. See vou there!

Finally as it is year end and my next column will be in 2010, I would like to wish you all a very peaceful Happy Christmas.

Dear Santa,


Just the other day Granny took me to a brilliant toy shop. She said it reminded her of her childhood. She said it was like a trip down memory lane.

Douglas recalls his wartime experiences for 'Britain at War' dvd



The recollections of local World War II veteran, Douglas Newdick, have been recorded for posterity in a new four-disk dvd set entitled 'Britain at War'.

Douglas, who lives in Caterham-on-the-Hill, was approached by Aaron Hutchinson of 'Simply Media', who produced the dvds. Aaron was put in touch with Douglas after contacting the Italy Star Association for soldiers who fought in Italy. Although Douglas was at the fight for Monte Cassino in 1944, it was his experiences in El Alamein in North Africa in 1942 that Aaron wanted Douglas to talk about in front of the camera.

"I arrived in El Alamein on 31st July 1942," recalled Douglas. "I was part of the 44th Home Counties Division of the Eigth Army. We got so badly smashed up that three months after arriving in the desert our division was split up."

The set of dvds tells the story of World War II in including chapters `ΕΙ



It is Caterham's most exciting community project and the Trust has already poured in £1.39 million. The building is almost ready (again) but it needs work and money to set it up properly. 

CAB urges families to check new benefits rules

More families with children will now be able to get help towards paying their rent thanks to new changes to benefit rules which came into effect from Monday 2nd November. From that date income from child benefit is no longer taken into account when it comes to calculating entitlement to housing benefit and council tax benefit.

Caterham & Warlingham Citizens Advice Bureau is urging parents who receive child benefit and live in rented accommodation, but who at present get no housing benefit, to check their entitlement again. It estimates that a single parent with two children, for example, who previously just missed out on getting any help towards paying the rent could now be entitled to housing benefit of up to £21.58 a week

I recently visited The Fox in Old Coulsdon to try out their new Winter Warmer Selection menu, which is currently available alongside the old favourites on the regular menu.

The Fox is very welcoming with soft lights, comfort-able seating and real fires with the ambience of a Whilst country cottage. waiting for our meals we enjoyed a selection of warm Mediterranean breads served with infused olive oil and balsamic vinegar. The starter I chose was the Tempura Tiger Prawns served with a plum. coriander and toasted sesame seed dipping sauce as prawns are a real favourite of mine. The batter was extremely light and the dipping sauce was wonderful! My partner Peter chose the Roasted Mushrooms Flat stuffed forest mushrooms, with cream cheese and thyme

cured bacon and rocket which were cooked to perfection; they are also served without the bacon for a vegetarian option. For my main course I chose Spanish Chicken, breast of chicken stuffed with goat's cheese and chorizo served on roasted peppers and crisp baby potatoes with basil pesto. The chicken was moist and all the flavours were delightful. Peter chose the Lamb Shank Jardaloo, tender lamb shank in a spicy spinach curry sauce with cumin, chili and paprika, finished with juicy apricots served with coconut and almond rice and a pop-padom. The meat was tender and succulent and the sauce had a really spicy kick. All the dishes came beautifully presented. Our waiter suggested one of their new selection of wines, the Sangiovese Luigi Leonardo red which truly complemented our meal. All the waiting staff were helpful and attentive, making our evening all the more enjoyable.

As side orders we had Spicy Begun, nice juicy aubergine cooked Bengal style and





Rose & Young - the Council's response

I refer to Gordon Frith's letter in your November edition about the Rose & Young site.`*

I share the concerns of local residents and businesses about the building's appearance, but the site is privately owned. As such, the Council has limited scope for solving the problem and has decided it cannot risk millions of pounds of taxpayers' money to acquire the site on a speculative hasis

The Council has invited the owners to discuss 'the car park plan', but they have not responded. In the absence of the owners' consent, this particular initiative could cost the Council in the region of £2m. Speculative and risky expenditure on this scale would exhaust our reserves - something I could not justify to council tax payers for the sake of improving one single site. The issue has been debated by councillors and we have taken the decision not to pursue the proposal.

An initiative with adequate financial backing from other sources remains the only realistic solution. The Council did grant planning permission for offices to the owners back in 2003, but I assume they did not find it

economically viable to proceed. However, as a planning authority, we are keen enable a sustainable to scheme and remain available to advise and encourage any prospective developers who have ideas for the site.

While this response will bring little comfort to your readers, I hope it clarifies the situation. The Council cannot act as a property speculator, by acquiring a site which risks so much public money.

R.A.F Association


