

We have plans to upgrade the children's playground and also, subject to raising of funds, instal facilities for teenagers and older children, but we are open to suggestions."

Ticking off the 'to do' list

Interview with Surrey County Councillor, Sally Marks by Julia Church

Following her recent reelection as Surrey County Councillor for Caterham Valley, Sally Marks from Woldingham is determined to continue to work for improvements to her ward. "I really want to see through and get things achieved that are in the pipeline already," said Sally. "I am always frustrated at how long things take. To do something about the Rose & Young site in Croydon Road is on my magic wish list and I think the whole of the community should try and encourage the owner to do something about it. There is not enough money in local government to buy it and I have every sympathy Tandridge District Council who had a reduction in its grant. If they were to buy the site they would have to make huge savings

elsewhere so I would like to ask people 'What would you be willing to do without in order to buy Rose & Young?' Maybe have rubbish collection every two weeks instead of every week, for example? We have talked about having a protest or getting together a petition to present to the owner but we haven't done that. People need to make their voices heard."

The new Youth Centre in Godstone Road is one of the initiatives that Sally is spearheading. "Unfortuspearheading. nately I have heard that there is going to be a delay in the opening of the facility because there is a big problem with the roof but I am working very hard to make sure the delay is limited," explained Sally.

"The recent clean-up operation in Stafford Road



Back in the driving seat Councillor Sally Marks Recreation Ground was fantastic. I think we saw a glimmer there of the community starting to take responsibility for their surroundings. I don't mind getting my hands dirty to get things started and that is where personal responsibility kicks in - it is not about me lecturing people. We have seen with the Festival how fantastic it is when the community works together and if we can extend that into other aspects of the community that would be great."

Planning permission refused for Kenley Airfield fence

The latest MoD planning application for a fence around the perimeter track at Kenley Airfield was rejected by neighbouring Croydon Council on June 11th, when its Planning Committee refused permission for the one and three-quarter mile long, four foot high fence.

The MoD has three months in which to appeal against this decision. Meanwhile, in late May 'temporary' barriers were erected at various noints around the airfield The MoD says that these are a necessary 'health and safety' measure to determine whether conflict can be eliminated between gliding equipment and leisure use of the airfield without using a permanent fence. Portley Ward Councillor Hi-

lary Turner says: "Several residents have already contacted me about these temporary barriers. Please get in touch with me if you have a view. That will help me at future meetings where this issue is discussed."

'Tea Time to Dance' is a great opportunity to develop creative skills, dance, moveexercise ment, and performance, culminating in taking part in a dance film. The project is being funded by the Big Lottery Fund and is supported by the Local Authority Arts Partnership. No prior skills or partners are needed, just the desire to move and explore dance in a creative way with enthusiasm. The project also

offers the possibility for both carers and the young people they look after to work and dance together. Tandridge Leisure has organised two taster workshops at de Stafford Sports Centre in Burntwood Lane, Caterham to offer people the chance to get a feel for the project. They will take place on Thursday 9th and Thursday 16th July at 2.30pm for the over 50's and 4.15pm for young people and cost just £1. Burtenshaw's Beat

I am concerned that some of you may be troubled by recent reports you may have heard or seen regarding public disorder and gangs in and around Caterham. I would like to reassure you that it is over two years since we have had a gang related incident in Tandridge. The incident at the fair on Westway Common on Friday, 12th June, was the first in a long time and it was people travelling into Caterham to cause problems. That does not mean that we rest on our laurels. As a team we have been building on our cross-border working with colleagues from the Metropolitan, Kent and British Transport Police carrying out joint patrols, sharing intelligence and running joint surgeries that we have just commenced once a month at the BP Service Station in Whyteleafe. On the Friday in question we had a tri-force operation running with the Metropolitan and British Transport Police targeting people using the rail network to travel to other areas to commit crime. Operation Miller, as it was codenamed, had positive results and has also assisted with information in relation to the incident at the fair.






Both events were blessed with warm sunshine, as was the Street Party and Dene Fete which has been the icing on the cake for Caterham's first Festival.





Try something new at 'The Curry Leaf'! Review by Julia Church

We are very fortunate in this creamy almond sauce district to be served by numerous excellent restaurants with food from all over the world and if you fancy trying some excellent Indian the flavour of the mussels and Bangladeshi cuisine, The Curry Leaf is definitely worth a visit. You can be sure of a warm welcome from the owner, Ali Uddin, and his friendlly staff are alwavs on hand to ensure you have an enjoyable evening. The menu boasts a host of exotic dishes and if you're not sure what to try, Ali will come up with a recommendation to suit your taste.

On a visit last month my partner Keith and I decided to go for dishes we hadn't had before, just to be adventurous, and we started with Mussels Rangila for Keith and Palak, a 'famous Indian street snack', for me. Keith's generous serving of mussels was completely covered in a thick and

mussels as we had never seen them before! The taste, however, was superb - the sauce didn't obscure but complimented them very well. Be warned, this starter is very filling so bear that in mind when ordering your main course! My Palak was rather like an Onion Bhaji, but with creamy spinach in the centre intasted great dipped in Keith's almond sauce!

Keith decided to choose a highly recommended sea food dish, the Trout Khakri, for his main course, a medium to hot dish with the trout cut into small pieces and cooked with onions, herbs and spices in a bhaji formula. His verdict was 'unusual, but very enjoyable'. I opted for a House Speciality dish, the Special Curry Leaf Balti - a tangy



In the garden

A few days ago I was asked to re-pot a Japanese Acer as the large pot in which it was planted had cracked in several places and pieces were falling off. The tree had grown to eight or nine feet high and is a magnificent specimen. Acers, of course, are grown for their foliage and this one had certainly outgrown its pot but still managed to survive.

Re-potting periodically is necessary to prevent plants becoming pot-bound. This occurs when their roots have completely permeated the compost and become tightly packed in the pot.

The signs of a pot-bound plant are a stunted growth, yellowing of leaves and a wilting appearance, despite regular watering. Any plant which has outgrown its existing pot is likely to benefit from being re-planted into a larger pot, enabling the roots to grow more freely. In addition, it will provide the nutrients found in the new compost which the plant requires to thrive.

At this time of year when growth is good, do not be too concerned about root disturbance. Aim to remove

as much of the old growing medium as possible while minimising root damage, something quite different from disturbance. Tease out "balled" roots, otherwise they will continue to grow round in circles, a feeling we | 01883 335867. all know from time to time! Potting on, together with new compost and top dressing undertaken at the correct time, are essential for the well-being of plants which spend their life in containers. They can then expect healthy and vigorous growth and become free flowering.
