patients and their families are at the heart of everything we do. St. Catherine's isn't just bricks and mortor; it's a philosophy of care."

120 patients from Caterham were transferred to St. Catherine's last month and the staff work hard to provide practical and medical support for the patients. The hospice was established 25 years ago and has cared for 13,000 people at the end of their lives. Most of their work takes place outside of the hospice with 70% of their patients being cared for in their own homes.

MP for East Surrey Peter Ainsworth conveyed his enthusiasm for the hospice at the lunch, saying: "There is a real sense of professionalism, compassion and care when you visit the hospice. The people of Caterham do not know what they have been missing."

All the care that is provided by St. Catherine's is free and so the hospice relies on their supporters and volunteers. Surrey County Coun-cillor for Caterham Valley Sally Marks is eager for the community to support the local project. "This is about the whole community being

able to support the project and we all need to think of ways of supporting St. Catherine's" she said. For more information on St. Catherine's hospice go to www.stch.org.uk

County Council condemns EDF

Surrey County Council has taken EDF to task over their poor performance and failure to meet targets set by national regulator OFGEM. The council has been unhappy with EDF's performance for some time, and EDF made a commitment to work towards meeting the targets set by national regulator OFGEM. Unfortunately EDF has shown almost no improvement in the time taken to fix faults during the last year and is still significantly below the OFGEM targets.

Despite their performance being so poor, EDF has announced almost a 20% increase in costs for street lighting work this year, without any notification or consultation and on top of significant cost increases in the last few years.

David Hodge, Chairman of the Council's Transport Select Committee, said: "We are extremely disappointed with EDF. To impose significant cost increases on top of such poor performance is totally unacceptable."

Mr Hodge added: "Our residents are not getting the service they deserve. Unfortunately, EDF is a mo-nopoly and we can't just go to another provider.

The committee agreed at a recent meeting to write to EDF to press for improvements and to get EDF to obtain the OFGEM targets. The committee will also be working alongside other councils to pressurize EDF and they will be lobbying OFGEM to do the same.

The East Africa Trust - continuing to improve lives

Caterham resident Tristan Cooper has set off on his latest trip to Malawi in his role as founder of the East Africa Trust charity (EAT). The primary aim of EAT is to help alleviate poverty and malnutrition in Malawi and Rwanda through improved irrigation techniques, soil management, composting and agricultural education. Last year the charity bought three acres of land on the shore of Lake Malawi, named Bamboo Beach. Before he departed Tristan spoke of his plans for his six month visit: "The plan is to provide a community training centre where we can demonstrate in practical terms a variety of vital skills for the local people.

"By teaching good agricultural practices, we will be able to provide for ongoing soil improvement and good nutrition, which will lead to better health".

2009 sees the charity continuing to develop the land and providing trees for fruit and building materials. They are also about to start building a classroom and some basic accommodation.

There will be a report on the charity's progress in the Caterham and District Independent this autumn.

In the garden

As the days grow longer and warmer, many spring flowers are beginning to fade or have already died back. Thoughts have probably turned to replacing crocus, daffodil and tulip bulbs with geraniums, petunias, bizzie lizzies and the other usual suspects.

Do not be in a hurry to put such thoughts into action iust vet. Most bulbs will benefit from dead-heading but leave the stems to die back naturally as this will help feed the bulb, hopefully producing good flowering next season. After two or three seasons in the same

place, most bulbs will naturalize, producing bulblets or cormlets. If these small bulbs are allowed to develop without being re-located to other areas of the border or bed, they can become overcrowded and will compete for nutrients in the soil. This will almost certainly result in a reduction in flowerina.

Lifting and dividing clumps of bulbs or corms every three or four years will be beneficial to the bulbs themselves and also increase the floral display at very little effort and no cost! Should you wish to lift and store bulbs for replanting in the autumn months, ensure they are not damaged by the fork, shake off the ex-

cess soil and store in a cool dry place. Taking out bulbs in areas which may be subject to water-logging during periods of heavy summer rain is certainly the preferred option. This will prevent rotting which will occur in very wet conditions.

Whilst different bulbs will have different needs, most can be lifted or divided when the foliage has died back. This will enable the bulbs to be located easily.

Having mentioned corms I should point out that cyclamens do not like disturbance so any attempt to move them may not be successful.

As always, there is plenty to do in the garden - happy aardenina.



When the Buddha Oriental Restaurant opened last month in Kenley, the local residents were delighted to have such a superb restaurant in their midst and have been keen to try out its delicious and unusual dishes from the Far Fast.

The food is quite simply superb. Diners can eat as much as they want from a selection of perfectly cooked starters, intermediate courses, mains and deserts with no rules - spend all night dining on as many starters as you wish if that is your choice!

The Buddha is Ray Chai's first restaurant. Ray is a charming young entrepreneur with a passion for introducing diners to new dishes from the Far East, including Malaysia, Japan and Thailand. He




wants his customers to try things hanced by the choice of gentle they will not have had before and will be changing the menu regularly so there is always something new for his customers to try


