

### Smart new look for town centre Cont. from page 1

Caterham is to see the first major improvements to the town since the completion of the ABC ('A Better Caterham') Healthcheck survey of the local population in June 2007. Since then, the ABC Group, which has since become the Caterham Community Partnership Ltd., ('CCP') has been working hard behind the scenes to gain access to funds and develop a plan to see improvements to the town centre, one of the key areas of concern highlighted by the results of the survey. The group has been working closely with Surrey County Council Highways department on the pilot scheme, which will involve removal of some of the railings in The Square, the installation of planters, resurfacing of the road and pavements and new street lighting.

Pamela Cosgrove and Nigel Wilkinson of CCP have been leading the project supported by Scott Coughlan at Tandridge District Council.

Pamela Cosgrove said: "It is nice to see something come to fruition that is so good for the community. Those who completed the ABC survey in 2007 may have thought that nothing would change as a result, but there have been a lot of people quietly working to address the issues raised in the survey. It is good that something is at last being done that is really quite exciting for the town."

Nigel Wilkinson commented: "CCP are fully committed to this project and are determined to make it a success. We are enjoying great support from all the authorities."

The main work will be completed by the end of the school holidays this summer with the street lighting scheduled to be installed next year. A presentation on the scheme will be dis-

Progress towards the reopening of the ARC arts and recreational centre has been swift since the new management team took over last month.



On the morning of Thursday, 21st January, a valuable antique violin, a viola and a beautiful oak violin case were amongst the items stolen during a burglary at Robert Grummitt's violin shop in the High Street, Caterham-on-the-Hill. The three items, worth over £3,000 formed the shop's window display but more valuable violins from inside the shop were also taken by the thieves.

Mr Grummitt commented: "The thieves specifically targetted the valuable violins, because they had price tickets tucked inside them. The window glass is very thick so they went to great efforts to smash it. It is just weird, it doesn't add up - they will be very difficult to sell for cash. These are not easilydisposable items that burglars normally go for."

Well what a month January has been, what with the snow that remained with us causing problems for vehicles and pedestrians alike. I appreciate those members of the community that not only heeded warnings regarding not making a jourabsolutely unless necessary but also dug out roads and assisted elderly neighbours. There is always a minority that insist on ignoring road closed signs and when they get stuck feel it is everyone else's responsibility, insulting my staff and that of partner agencies. I had staff unable to get home that slept in the Police Station. My plea to the minority is please be as considerate as the majority of Tandridge residents were!

I am concerned that we are having an increasing number of calls from householders who state they have been receiving phone calls from alarm/security companies who say either Surrey Police has passed on their details and /or that we have recommended them. We will never pass your details onto security companies and we do not recommend companies. Home Office advice is to obtain at least



three quotes and specialist advice from companies that are registered with either the National Security Inspectorate or Security Systems and Alarm Inspection Board. Your insurance company may be able to recommend one but ensure the alarm meets British Standard BS4737 or BS6799 or European standard EN50131-1. Please contact us should you receive such calls.

Finally I would like to reassure readers following the attempted robbery and armed robbery in Whyteleafe and Caterham on Tuesday, 19th January. The two offences are not connected and this is an extremely unusual occurrence in the District. I know my colleagues in CID are keen to hear from anyone regarding abandoned blue Tregistration Renault Meganes in their area. If you believe you have any information, no matter how small, in relation to either of the crimes please contact Surrey Police on 08451 252222 or if you wish to remain anonymous ring Crimestoppers on 0800 5551111.

Each £1 contributed will be match funded by The Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation by a further £1.78.

Polio is a crippling, and sometimes fatal, disease and still a very harrowing reality for children in parts of Africa and Asia.

Every £1 raised in this campaign will purchase five doses of the special anti-polio vaccine. These children, mainly under age five, will be protected against polio forever.

Polio eradication has been Rotary's top priority since 1985, where it has led the private sector in the global effort to rid the world of this crippling disease with more

than \$1.2 billion contributed to the effort.

Thanks to Rotary's help, two billion children have been protected from the disease, and the number of endemic countries has fallen from 125 to just four: Afghanistan, northern India, Nigeria and Pak-

It is estimated that five million children have been spared from disability and 250,000 deaths have been averted.

The Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation has now awarded US\$255 million to Rotary International in the global effort to eradicate polio, bringing the total committed by Rotary and the Gates Foundation to \$555 million.

Bill Gates has praised Rotary for providing the volunteers and donors who have helped bring about a 99 percent decline in the number of polio cases. "The world would not be where it is without Rotary, and it won't get where it needs to go without Rotary," he said.

In addition to providing financial and volunteer support, Rotary works to urge support from other

public and private sector partners. This includes the campaign to End Polio Now, inspired by the extraordinary challenge grants received from the Gates Founda-

Rotary International is a worldwide voluntary organisation of 1.2 million individuals. In Great Britain and Ireland there are over 55,000 men and women of all ages from all walks of life in Rotary clubs, all of whom share a passion and commitment to helping and improving communities both locally and across the world. 





### 'The Village Inn' Food is served at The Village - a restaurant steeped in local heritage

Many local residents will remember the days when Caterham was a garrison town and soldiers from Caterham Barracks mingled with residents during their leisure time. The Caterham Arms was one of their favourite watering holes, on the corner of Westway and Coulsdon Road. Soon after Caterham Barracks became The Village, the Caterham Arms became The Village Inn, and the new owner, Steve Kirk transformed the rather forlorn old building into a fashionable pubrestaurant. It's comfortable, spacious interior provides the perfect setting for wedding receptions and parties, and a great performing area for the popular live music nights.

Inn at lunchtimes and evenings, offering a good selection of traditional favourites and a very reasonably-priced winelist to choose from.

When I dined there with my partner Keith, we had come in from the freezing cold and were soon tucking into some lovely hot starters. Keith chose the Crispy Duck Flutes served with hoisin sauce and I had the Mini Thai Fishcakes with a sweet chilli dip. Our traditional courses contrasted nicely with the exotic flavours of our starters, with Keith opting for a perfectly-cooked Rump Steak while I tucked into the Steak and Ale Pie "Wedge".

Both meals came served with chips and peas and were very filling. At just £7.95 for the Steak and Ale Pie and £10.95 for the Rump Steak, the meals offered great value for money. Other mains on offer included Liver & Bacon, Battered Haddock, Spaghetti



Carbonara and Gammon Steak. There was also a selection of pizzas and salads to choose from and at just £3.99, the baguettes and jackets are perfect for a lunchtime treat.



The housing sales market improved in the last quarter of 2009 from a very low base in 2008. This year there is an immediate shortage of properties for sale locally, keeping asking prices high; mortgages remain difficult for most people to access, and we face a very uncertain economic and political future.



### Could you be an 'urban shepherd'?

The Downlands Countryside Management project is looking for volunteer stock checkers or 'urban shepherds' to spend an hour a week checking livestock across East Surrey.

Sheep, goats, cattle and Dartmoor ponies graze sites all across East Surrey, including sites near Caterham, Banstead and Purley. Grazing with livestock helps stop scrub re-growth over the rare chalk grassland, and also varies the length of grass helping to attract a variety of insects, birds, mammals and flowers. The role of urban shepherd involves checking the animals are healthy and happy, checking the fence lines are not damaged by fallen trees, and making sure the animals have food and water.

Kate Mayo of the Downlands Countryside Management Project said: "The snow last month caused problems for the animals, as their food source was covered over. We had to go out to all the sites every day and feed them by hand, and break the ice on their water troughs!
