# **Anguish as cemetery** runs out of plots

Families wishing to bury their loved ones in Caterham Cemetery are being told that there is no more space available and they will have to make arrangements for a burial elsewhere. Most bereaved families are not aware of the situation until funeral plans are being made after losing a loved one.

Local resident, Peter Jenner, wanted the situation highlighted in the local press following the traumatic Peter Wyer, when he lost his wife Susan in December.

Mr Jenner said: "Tandridge District Council has known for some years that burial plots at Caterham Cemetery were running short but no alternative arrangements were made. This was despite the fact that an adjacent plot next to St. Mary's Church remained undeveloped for years."

Mr Jenner added: "A burial at Green Lawns Cemetery costs considerably more than a burial at Caterham Cemetery. An elderly person living in Caterham who loses a family member or friend will not only find this additional cost prohibitive, the distance they will need to travel to visit the grave of a loved one will difficult prove extremely mindful of imminent cuts to local bus services between Caterham and Chelsham."

A statement from Tandridge District Council said:

"We agree local residents should be able to be buried alongside other members of their families, or at their local graveyard. Unfortunately, there is no more space left for burials at the Caterham Burial Ground. This is a common problem across the country and was addressed on national radio recently.

Delivered door-to-door to homes and businesses in Caterham, Warlingham, Whyteleafe, Kenley, Hamsey Green, Old Coulsdon, Chaldon and Netherne-onthe-Hill. There is no statutory duty on the Council to provide a burial ground, which means it is not a priority at a time when we are trying to maintain our key services, while having to make savings. The cost of buying land and turning it into a burial ground would be considerable and the Council does not have the resources to do this, even if it was agreed. There are also planning matters to be taken into consideration.

Until about 20 years ago, cemeteries were identified in national Green Belt policy as being an acceptable item in a Green Belt. Following national Planning Policy Guidance in 1992 about Green Belts (PPG2) that presumption was removed. It is unlikely a new cemetery would now be identified as 'appropriate development' and 'very special circumstances' would need to be demonstrated to justify a grant of permission. Accordingly, planning permission has always been a major issue in terms of burial provision. Some proposals have been made, but have been withdrawn prior to a likely refusal being issued."

## Views differ on meeting affordable housing needs

Tandridge District Council's public consultation on planning policy, which ends on 11th March, includes an assessment as to which villages and settlements within the district should continue as Green Belt Settlements. The subject of the Green Belt raises differing opinions on Green Belt development policy within the Tandridge district.

The Council's Core Strategy adopted in 2008 requires the Council to deliver 2,500 homes between 2006 and 2026 and indicates that this will happen by the use of land within the built up areas of the district. Green Belt land will only be released if insufficient land can be found in built up areas. An assessment of what land might be available over the next 15 vears is due to be considered by the Council's Planning Policy Committee on 3rd March. A spokesperson for the Council said that they anticipate there will be more than enough homes delivered to meet the requirement of 2,500 without the need to release Green Belt land. The Council, however, is not so optimistic about meeting targets for affordable homes. The Council has 1,661 households on the waiting list but predict they cannot deliver more than 300 units over the next 15 years. The Core Strategy noted that: "...in common with most other councils in the South East, this requirement cannot be met in full." The Core Strategy does not provide for the release of green field Green Belt land to meet this aim.

Commenting on the situation, John Orrick, Surrey County Councillor for Caterham-onthe-Hill, said: "I think it is time to have a sensible, grown up debate about it. I personally think that it is the areas of Green Belt within the built up areas that are the most important to preserve in order to protect the character of the area that we have. I think you can certainly look at expanding some of the hamlets without harming anything. You could have three or four new properties added to a hamlet without it spoiling the countryside. What we don't want is more new housing developments like in Stanstead Road in Caterham. Big old houses are being knocked down and replaced with five

or six new ones which spoils the whole character of the road."

Local property developer. Nigel Greenhalgh of Village Developments believes that releasing a tiny proportion of Green Belt green field land is the only solution. He said: "Tandridge is 94% Green Belt and we are running out of brown belt land. We only need to release 1% of Green Belt land in Tandridge to solve the housing problem. The principle function of the Green Belt policy was to prevent coalescence - the merging together of towns.

"Adding a few new houses to existing hamlets and building on sites within built-up areas will go nowhere near meeting housing require-ments. We are in the middle of a national housing crisis. People's perceptions need to change because the way we are heading things will be like Victorian times again, with thousands of young people living with their parents with no chance of getting married and having a family in a home of their own. The problem is that if you mention the Green Belt there is a phobia about it. The councillors have to be proactive about dealing with housing needs." Continued on page 3

In conclusion, John Orrick said: "The situation requires huge sensitivity on the part of developers and the planners and society has to compromise."

Residents have until 11th March to make their views known to Tandridge District Council on planning policies, including the future of villages that are currently designated Green Belt Settlements. The consultation documents can be viewed





# Hopi Ear Candling - a great treatment all year round!

Candling originates from the Native American Hopi Indians and can help many ear, nose and throat problems such as sinusitis, sore throats, snoring and much more. Ear Candling also has emotional benefits by inducing calmness and alleviating stress.

One candle at a time is lit, inserted into the ear, and held in place by the therapist, whilst you lie comfortably on your side on the treatment couch. Each candle takes approximately ten minutes to burn. The vapours from the candle



penetrate the ear and create tiny vibrations; these gently massage the tympanic membrane (ear drum) and draw any impurities to the surface. Excess pressure is released within the inner ear, which can prove very helpful for people who suffer from pain in their ears during a plane journey or whilst diving. The enriched vapour protects and soothes the auditory canal.

The treatment concludes with a relaxing Aromatherapy head, face and neck massage.






