Chairman, Jean Baker said: Over the past few years we have appealed for extra manpower to help us set up and take down the Fête. Unfortunately we cannot get the help we need so I am saddened to report that the Committee has decided that the Summer Fête in 2012 will not be held. The sheer effort is too much for our small group of ageing Committee members and we feel now is the time to call it a day."

The event has also been affected by the recession, with people having less disposable income to spend at fundraisers like the Dene Fête. This summer's Fête raised £3,400 compared with over £4,000 two years ago.

The Fête has long been part of the fabric of Caterham and over the years its supporters have helped the League of Friends purchase valuable equipment for the Caterham Dene Hospital. Its members are now looking at alternative ways of raising funds.

The Warlingham Christmas Lights go low energy ready for switch-on

The Warlingham Christmas Lights Committee is preparing a more eco-friendly display for Warlingham Green this year, ready for the switching-on ceremony on Saturday, 26th November. There will be extra lights on at least one featured tree on The Green and energy saving light bulbs wil be used for all the lights.

The festivities on the 26th will begin at 4pm, building up to the children of local pri-

mary schools setting out on the traditional lantern parade around the centre of the village, led by the Warlingham Flute Band. The lights themselves will be switched on at 5pm, followed by carols from a combined children's choir. There will be a Christmas market in the Village Hall and stalls in the Church Hall from 4pm, and from 5.15pm Santa will be in his grotto in the Church Hall. Throughout the event there will be children's rides and lots to eat and drink. Many of the businesses around The Green will remain open late or be staging special events.

Volunteers will be raising money with collections, raffles and the sale of the new Warlingham Christmas Lights 2011 badges.

A very special raffle will be held on the afternoon before the switch on, with the winner winning the right to switch on the lights.

Lion volunteers were briefed on how to guide a visually impaired person by Diana Drysdale, a member of SAVI, Surrey Association for Visual impairment, before their guests arrived. Nick Childs braved the checkout area and successfully managed to purchase some biscuits, check his change and get safely back to the Lions base. Throughout the morning members of the public were invited to be guided blindfolded and round or to try on glasses that simulated various eyesight disorders. Children also joined in by having a

Diary of a Plantaholic

by Sue Baines

Summer returned gloriously, but briefly, now it's catch up time. Last year having lost all dahlia tubers stored in the shed, I fell for every value advert, now I have rather a lot! Some have only just started to flower, so there were some interesting combinations, not all to my liking. To remedv this I have taken a bloom, held it against established beds, to see where it would look best, (you can do this with other perennials), before actually moving them. Autumn, when the soil is still warm, is a good time to move plants.

Now we have had some frost, the dahlias have been cut down, dug out and dry removed, soil sulphur puffed over the tubers, and dry newspaper wrapped around them. A label stating colour, height and next year's position, is tied around the 4 inch (approx.) stem and placed upside



down. To save space, I have bought six shoe hangers each has six compartments - and hang them from the garage roof. They are nice and airy and will fold down to nothing next year. Hopefully they will work.

The tubers that did overwinter were the ones left in the ground. They had a nice duvet over them! A good layer of well rotted compost and on top of that an unopened bag of horse manure, turned occasionally to remove any hibernating slugs and snails.

The 'big sweep' is in progress, in conjunction with emptying the compost bins and leaf boxes, - beware sweeping up the ash keys or a forest of ash results the following spring. Life's too short!

We both decided to have the Espinacas con Nata (spinach with garlic, chilli, cheese and cream) as our tapas starter, followed by Patas de Cangrejo (crablets), Pollo al Ajillo (bone-in chicken in garlic and white wine), Chorizo Riojana (hot Spanish sausage fried in Rioja wine) and Patata Brava (deep fried potatoes in tomato, garlic and chilli sauce) to share for our main course. The spinach starter was described by Jill as 'lovely!' with small pieces of chille giving a subtle kick to a beautifully creamy dish.


The selection of tapas that followed was declared by Jill (after a glass of white wine) to

While staying mother in Caterham recently, I was delighted to read the article about the restoration of the St. Lawrence's Hospital burial ground in Chaldon.

It was quite a coincidence because I had just written an account of my early teenage years in Caterham for my Writers' Group in Switzerland where I now live. This memoir included descriptions of several visits to the burial ground that two friends and I had first discovered whilst biking around the fields behind St. Lawrence's.

It looked neglected and overgrown even then, over 50 years ago. I remember pushing open the rusty iron gate into this secret place. The little chapel there had ledges or shelves inside which were, we decided, to hold the coffins. Next to it were a couple of full-length graves.

Once, after having a midnight feast in Queen's Park, we three girls dared ourselves to venture there, and,

on arrival, we used our torches to peer into the gap which had formed between the gravestone and the earth beneath.

So, after reading the newspaper article, I set off with a friend. And, with the help of a kind gentleman called Paul. we found the site, which we now saw was next to a golf course.

What a change - I hardly recognised it! We couldn't see the chapel, or the graves as we remembered them, but noticed two stone angels marking children's resting places, and there were also

some other small headstones.

I was comforted to know that the souls resting under the earth were not forgotten, because they at last had been acknowledged and lay in a worthy and dignified garden of rest.

Find your 'Optimum Training Zone' by Steve Robertson, Master Personal Trainer X-T.R.E.M.E. Training

I get asked many times by clients in my X-T.R.E.M.E. classes: "What is my maximum Heart Rate"? (MHR). To work your heart and lungs most efficiently and to burn fat you need to aim to work between 65 and 85 per cent of your MHR - this is known as your 'optimum training zone'. To calculate your MHR let's assume that your MHR when you are born is 220, reducing by one for every year of your life, so basically 220 minus vour age.

Let's take an age of 35 years, your MHR is 185 beats per minute (BPM), 65% of 185 is 120, and 85% of 185 is 157.

When you train aim to keep your heart rate above 120 bpm but below 157 bpm. If you train above your optimum training zone you start to work anaerobically and your body can't keep up with the demand for oxygen; you won't be able to



sustain a workout at such high intensity and you will quickly become exhausted. The best way to monitor your heart rate is by using a heart rate monitor, or by taking your pulse manually. As you learn more about how your body responds to exertion, you will find you can recognise what heart rate vou are working at by how you are feeling.

So now you all know how to calculate your MHR I shall see you all in my X-T.R.E.M.E. training classes to really push your heart rate to new heights!


