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Development plans unveiled for site of Caterham Cars

On Thursday 16th February, members of the public were able to view the plans for a proposed development by Churchill Retirement Living on the site currently occupied by the Caterham Cars showroom and workshop. Residents living close to the site of the proposed development had been invited to the exhibition at the Soper Hall by the Hampshire-based architects, 'Planning Issues'. Representatives of the firm were on hand to answer questions and explain the finer detail of the

plans with visitors. The scheme would provide 33 retirement flats for the over 60s, retail units on the site currently occupied by the showroom on the corner of Station Avenue and Stafford Road and 12 car parking spaces. Commenting on the proposed scheme, Chris Windridge, Chairman of the Caterham Community Partnership, said: "The proposed development on the Caterham Cars site would almost certainly result in Caterham Cars leaving town altogether. At a time

when the town should be looking at 'Enterprise' and job creation, alongside any housing schemes, this is going absolutely in the wrong direction. Let's keep Caterham Cars in Caterham.

"If Churchill are interested in similar sites, then perhaps the ex Rose & Young site, with a retail ground floor and parking below would solve many issues for the town." Following the exhibition, Andrew Burgess, Managing Director of Planning Issues, said: "This proposal will bring forward much needed retirement housing in Caterham to address the needs of the ageing population and will also

retain employment within the

ground floor commercial units. We consider that the plan for a retirement development was well received by many people who attended the exhibition and a full summary of comments will be included as part of the planning application submission."

The planning application is expected to be submitted to Tandridge District Council at the beginning of April. In the meantime, anyone wishing to view and comment on the plans can contact Ellie Smith at Planning Issues on 01425 462144.

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Tandridge District Council agrees no **Council Tax increase**

At a Council meeting held on Thursday 16th February Tandridge District Council (TDC) agreed they would not increase the district's council tax for next

The Band D council tax for TDC remains the same as last year at £193.62, which is £3.72 a week for a wide range of services including refuse collection and replanning, street cvclina. sweeping, housing, housing benefits and children's play areas.

Surrey County Council, which provides services including education, adult social care, children's services and highways, together with the Surrey Police Authority, have agreed to increase their Band D level for 2012/2013. The result will be an average overall Band D Council Tax increase across the district including parish precepts of 2.63%. Chairman of the Resources Committee at Tandridge District Council. Councillor Martin Fisher, said: "For a second year running there is no increase in council tax and services have been protected. Through careful financial management we are one of the few councils to have maintained a high level of services for the benefit of our residents, with no in-

crease.

'We have absorbed a 29% cut in Government Grant support in the last two years and lower interest income by continuing to make substantial reductions to our support services, including staffing. Our staff have also demonstrated their commitment, by coping with a recruitment freeze which has been in place since 2008 and adopting flexible working practices.

"We continue to offer value for money by concentrating expenditure on providing and supporting front line services. We are particularly pleased to keep free shoppers' parking to support local businesses. Our garden waste collection service continues to grow, with over 5,400 households subscribing to it.

"We plan major changes to our recycling and waste contract for the benefit of the environment through reducing the amount of waste that goes to landfill, while maintaining weekly collections and a back door waste collection service.

"There is no doubt the next few vears will continue to be difficult, but we are confident we can maintain the services our residents value."

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

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Diary of a **Plantaholic**

With the icy breath of winter returning with a vengeance, only the most crucial of jobs, like feeding the birds and knocking off snow (to let in light and prevent damage) were undertaken.

Itching to start sowing seeds, I decided to sow only a few tomato and chilli seeds. These were kept on a warm, light windowsill, and turned regularly. The beauty of starting early is that if germination fails, the next lot can be quickly resown. If they fail on the second sowing then it might be a good idea to buy fresh seed. A lot of seeds are only viable for a couple of years. Growing from seed is probably one of the biggest challenges, but for me the most satisfying. It also keeps planting reasonably economic although I do use a lot of potting compost ... and time!

I am again trialling plants, which is almost as exciting



as seed sowing. I never know what the postman will bring next. I record how the plant is packaged, and what time it takes to get here. Notes are kept all season on their progress, so that new plants, or suppliers prove their worth.

The winter winds caused havoc to our beech trees at the bottom of the garden. Two loose branches hung precariously, drawing attention to further evident damage. Although the original damage had occurred in the '87 hurricane, we had them halved five years ago, and they appeared to be filling out nicely.

The woodland/ferny area will now take on a new persona, but for better or worse, remains to be seen.

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


especially my paella that I could not finish, despite being starving when I entered the restaurant.

Following on from Harold Barrett's letter in the February edition of The Caterham and District Independent, in front of the Morrisons car park should be 27 spaces. There are currently 25, as specified in the Contract of Sale between Tandridge District Council and the developers in 1987. The responsibility for those 27 spaces passed to the Church Walk Centre owners who leased it to Morrisons and before them Safeways. It has been out of Council hands since 1987.

Those 27 spaces must be kept open to the public, contractually, free of charge, outside of the normal trading hours, and the yellow gate opened when the main car park is closed. The eight spaces that appear to be in the Soper Hall, are, in fact not, but can only be accessed via the Soper Hall, due to bollards on the car park side. This has created a free for all for illegal parkers, with no business or connection with the Soper Hall. There are also mis-leading signs, indicating that this area is a public car park, which it is not. Whilst sympathising with Mr Bar-
