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School saves Old Park Woods for Caterham

On Friday 3rd January Caterham School completed the purchase of Old Park Woods and Gavelly Hill Woods, saving them from the threat of potential decimation by timber foresters. The woods adjoin the school's boundary, taking the overall size of the school campus to over 200 acres.

Headmaster Julian Thomas said: "This is a truly significant moment in the school's 202 year history. As a local resident, I am extremely pleased that we will be able to secure and preserve this

beautiful woodland for the future. We have already entered into discussions with the Forestry Commission about how best to take care of the woodland and make the best use of it. We are very privileged to have had this opportunity to secure the woodlands - it was a once in a lifetime, or even many lifetimes, opportunity!"

The school already has a high ropes course, climbing tower and outdoor classroom in the school grounds. The acquisition of the woods

will allow the school to further develop their programme of outdoor activities that include orienteering, bushcraft and camping.

bushcraft and camping.
Mr Thomas said: "We are passionate about the importance of highlighting to the children all the joys of being outside. The woodland will form part of our 'outdoors' project."

When the woods were put up for sale last summer the War Coppice Residents' Group launched a campaign to save the woods for the community. The site is a local beauty spot popular with walkers, although technically they have been trespassing on private land. Continued on page 2.

Chairman of the War Coppice Residents' Group, Tom Bennington, said: "I think this is great news for the school and great news for the community. We are very pleased the school have the woods rather than a timber foresting company and I hope the school will keep the woods forever and maintain their character."

"The Thomas said: school intends to allow public access assuming that there are no legal impediments to doing so and we will be able to give definitive guidance on this very soon.

"Our discussions with the Forestry Commission about public access are in the early stages but are looking very positive. With their help we will learn the best way to manage the woods, keep them beautiful and ensure they are safe. I want people to know we have their concerns very much in mind.

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
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Caterham Co-op targeted by masked raiders

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Diary of a **Plantaholic**

Getting out and clearing up all the soggy debris was quite a novelty after so much rain. A lot of the leaves had been blown into corners, and so even a little tidying had a big impact.

It's time to take stock of any damage that may have been done. Do look at any big trees in the vicinity. Are there branches hanging? Could a bit of work done now save a tree? Save a life? The last storms were really damaging, and our chainsaw which Geoff had serviced before the first storm, saw a fair bit of action.

The autumn planted bulbs starting to show are through. Popping the containers on feet/bricks, has kept them well-drained (crucial this year).

The spring bulb range is starting to appear in garden centres and shops now. I still have a few empty pots, and am determined to have colour in a visible spot from now on. I love the mini daffs, scented hyacinths,

snowdrops, aconites, Iris reticulata and anemone blanda, to name just a few. I plan to 'impulse buy' little pots of bulbs, planting them into the same big pot. 
great team whose singing, dancing and general antics, supported by a superb cast, made this new version of a classic story a real festive treat.

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Eating Out

Casa Lola - superb Spanish food and service with a smile!

Amongst the excellent choice of restaurants to be found in Caterham Valley is Casa Lola, for diners who like to enjoy a taste of the Mediterranean.

Being a Spanish restaurant, Casa Lola specialises in tapas and seafood, but also offers a selection of Italian pasta dishes at excellent prices (from £6.95-£9.95).

The restaurant has a board on the wall with 'specials' to choose from, which, on the day I visited with my mum Pam, included Sea Bass and Fillet Steak.

We decided to choose a selection of tapas. The beauty of tapas is that you can either go straight to your main course and select your favourite tapas dishes or you can pick one of the dishes to have as a starter first, which is what we did. Mum chose the Patas de Cangrejo (crablets) and I chose the Mejillones Marinara (Mussels Mariniero), a seasonal dish which was, fortunately, available on the night of our visit.

Mum said that her crablets were: "Lovely and plump and full of meat," and she commented on the attractive presentation, with a side salad. I had a generous serving of gorgeous mussels, which had been cooked in white wine, cream, onions, garlic and parsley.

For our main course there were so many wonderful tapas dishes to choose from,

but we selected our favourite, the Raxo (Pork Fillets Galician Style) which comes with chips, the Pinchos de Pollo (Chicken Kebab) with rice and to accompany them two vegetable dishes, the Espinacas con Nata (spinach with garlic, chilli, cheese and cream) and the Champinones Picantes (mushrooms, garlic, chilli and wine). We shared the tapas between us, accompanied by a delicious bottle of Rioja wine.

The pork of the Raxo was very tender because it is marinated for hours before cooking. A whole chicken breast goes into the chicken kebabs, of which there were two juicy portions on the plate. The vegetable dishes were a superb accompaniment, and we especially liked the beautifully creamy spinach.

The service was prompt and friendly throughout the evening and the food was lovely and hot. Although we were offered the dessert menu, a simple cup of coffee was the perfect end to a lovely meal.

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
