On Saturday 25th October over 200 people attended the dedication of the Woldingham Village Memorial which was unveiled by Her Majesty's Lord-Lieutenant of Surrey, Dame Sarah Goad DCVO 1P. Other VIPs present at the ceremony included the President of the Royal British Legion, Vice Admiral Peter Wilkinson CB CVO; Commander Nicholas Chatwin OBE RN, Naval Regional Command; the

Member of Parliament for East Surrey, Mr Sam Gyimah; the leader of Surrey County Council, Mr David Hodge and Surrey County Councillor for Woldingham and Caterham Valley, Mrs Sally Marks.

There were also many other representatives, both young and old, of uniformed and civilian groups present at the ceremony.

The service was led by the Team Vicar of Woldingham,

the Rev. Dr. Catherine Dowland-Pillinger, who welcomed those present and led everyone in saying The Lord's Prayer, before introducing Dame Sarah Goad for the dedication and unveiling of the Memorial. During the dedication, Dame Sarah spoke about the military personnel who had been stationed in Woldingham before going off to war and said: "This Memorial will not only remind us of the sacrifice made by so many people. Following the unveiling of the Memorial, four local schoolchildren read out the names of the 46 people commemorated on the Memorial.

During the First World War, men of the 16th 'Public Schools' Battalion of the Middlesex Regiment were stationed in Woldingham before going off to fight in the Battle of The Somme. Men of The West Scotia Regiment were billeted in Woldingham in the Second World War, some of whom went direct to the D Day Landings where Canadian troops suffered heavy casualties on Juno beach.

During his speech at the reception in the Village Hall afterwards, the Chairman of the Village Memorial Project Committee, Peter Johnson, said: "It has been a long, costly and, at times, controversial project but thank you to all of you who helped to raise funds and create the Woldngham Village Memorial."

Surrey County Council ('SCC') has undertaken a comprehensive review over the future of the last six older people's residential homes in Surrey still operated and maintained by the Council.

Following the review, the council is now undertaking a consultation amongst the residents of the homes, their families and staff to help the council make an informed decision on the future of the six homes.

A spokesman for SCC said: "The most important thing is to make sure older people receive the very best care. We're helping many more people stay in their own homes until much later in life and increasingly they need round the clock nursing when they do go into care. Our ageing homes are finding it harder and harder to provide this, which is why we're asking people for their views."

John Orrick, the Lib Dem Surrey County Councillor for Caterham-on-the-Hill, said: "Dormers is a much-valued residential care home. The current consultation by SCC about its future gives an opportunity for the commmunity and key stakeholders to express how

Man sentenced to life imprisonment for Caterham armed robbery

On Friday 17th October, David Bentley, 54, of Orpington in Kent, was sentenced to life imprisonment with a minimum of 14 years after being found guilty on four counts of robbery including the one against Thomas Cook Travel Agents in Caterham last year.

On Monday 8th July 2013 several members of staff at the travel agents in Croydon Road, that has since closed, were threatened by Bentley with what is believed to be a firearm before he left the store with over £15,000 in cash and travellers cheques.

Senior Investigating Officer Detective Inspector Sean Kelly, said: "This was a terrifying experience for all those who were in the store at the time of the robbery and I hope the guilty verdict and subsequent sentence goes some way to help their recovery following the incident. "I would like to praise the witnesses who bravely stood and gave evidence throughout the trial. This can be a daunting experience but if it wasn't for people like this we would not be able to secure convictions against dangerous individuals like Bentley."

St. John's Church hosts special 'Transfer of Colour Service' for St. John Ambulance

On Sunday 19th October, the annual Service of Rededication And The Transfer of Colour for the Order of St. John in Surrey and the Caterham Unit of St. John Ambulance took place in St. John's Church in Caterham Valley. This year's service was especially poignant, marking the 100th Anniversary of the Great War, where over 1,000 volunteers from St. John lost their lives.

The County Colour is itself a War Memorial to those who served in World War Two and conflicts since. This year it will pass from Caterham Unit who have cared for it during 2013/4 to the Horley Unit for 2014/5. The service of remembrance and rededication was followed by the presentation of Awards and Honours by the President of the County Priory Group for Surrey, Her Majesty's Lord-Lieutenant of Surrey, Dame Sarah Goad.



Diary of a Plantaholic

The weather dictates when we do the jobs this month as well as the fox, who has persistently aerated the lawn for us on a daily basis. The holes have been filled in with Lawn Soil, a bag we keep in the garage (by Evergreen).

Cutting the grass with the mower set on high has continued, as it is the perfect way of clearing all the leaves, plus being chopped up means they make great leaf mould much more quickly. The leaf mould bags (five very large exbuilding supplies canvas bags) have mostly been emptied, ready for this vear's leaves.

Back to the check list! The propagators are on, and I have belatedly tried to take cuttings of all my favourite plants. A thermometer is in place, because I like the doors open for as long as possible and the same goes for the cold frame. Ventilation, light and a lack of

decay will give plants the best chance. However, once it gets really cold, then the doors will close and the fan, now blowing cold air, will change to just frost free.

Most of the bulbs are planted, with a few tulips left. Lots are in pots and have been squirrel-proofed, with chicken wire over them. I need to make sure my pots are on 'feet' (bricks) to help with drainage and to stop them freezing, which in a bad winter can crack the pots.

The ponds have had foliage cut back as decaying foliage increases gas which can be fatal to fish if a thick layer of ice forms.

That is all from me for now until the February edition, when we will be looking forward to spring!





Bollywood - all the ingredients for a great night out!

With the Christmas party season almost upon us, Bollywood Indian restaurant in Godstone Road, Caterham Valley, is a popular choice for group celebrations.

Bollywood has established itself as a firm favourite in Caterham, not just for its excellent food, but also for the warm welcome and friendly ambience the restaurant consistently provides for its customers.

I dined there recently with my son Andrew and his girlfriend Marisa who both love Indian food. It was Marisa's first ever visit to Bollywood and as soon as we arrived she said how much she liked the bright and modern decor of the restaurant.

The food was up to the usual excellent Bollywood standard and the restaurant is very proud to have a prestigious five star hygiene rating.

We shared a variety of starters

that included Aloo Bora (deepfried mashed potato with a spicy kick), charcoal-roasted Adraki Lamb Chop and Chicken 65, which came with baby green chillies and delicatelyflavoured curry leaves, which Marisa particularly liked.

For our mains, Marisa had Murgh Sagrana - a wonderful chicken dish unique to Bollywood cooked with cream and spices. Andrew had another of the 'Chef's Specialities', the Loknal Gosht, which is a fairly hot dish cooked in a rich onion and tomto sauce. I had a superb dish from the Vegetarian Main Course section of the menu, the Sabzi Hariali (fresh vegetables cooked with mint and coriander) accompanied by Dall Samber (mixed vegetables and lentils flavoured with garlic).

To go with our main courses, we shared some Pilau Rice and freshly-baked Garlic Naan Breads. Marisa was very impressed






