Kenley Airfield celebrates National Lottery grant

Kenley Airfield Friends Group ('KAFG') has been on Cloud Nine after being awarded £881,000 by the National Lottery via the Heritage Lottery Fund.

The Kenley Revival Project, started in 2012, comprising KAFG, City of London and Historic England, was awarded the grant to preserve the airfield.

The Project plans to recruit 40-50 volunteers to help with the work which, with

additional donations from the respective groups, will bring the total value of the Project to f1.1 million.

The grant will also be used to create a virtual on-line museum, mobile exhibition and new information boards, with the work being carried out over the next three years.

The Kenley Revival Project will look to involve members of the community as much as possible and there

are also plans to establish a learning programme for schools.

Work has already begun on recruiting a Project Manager and a Learning and Volunteer Officer, with minor construction work to the site planned for spring 2016.

Kenley Airfield remains the most preserved airfield used during the Battle of Britain in 1940.

KAFG Chairman, Alan Morgan, said: "We really are thrilled. It is the culmination of three years' very hard

Rose & Young site contracts exchanged

The redevelopment of the former Rose and Young site, in Caterham, has taken a major step forward following the recent exchange of legal contracts between CoPlan Estates Ltd and Premier Inn.

CoPlan Estates Ltd, the preferred developer for the site, is currently preparing the planning application, which should be submitted early in 2016.

If the current owners of the site do not agree to sell the site to CoPlan Estates, an agreement is also in place for Tandridge District Council to use its Compulsory Purchaser Powers, to buy the site.

Colin McQueston, Director of CoPlan Estates, said: "We are delighted to have signed these two key legal agreements, which represent a significant step forward towards the long awaited development of this site. To have these agreements secured within three months of



Diary of a Plantaholic

With light levels and temperatures rapidly diminishing, the 2015 season is coming to a close. However, there are still plenty of jobs when the weather allows. First, the nets have been put over the big pond. The beech trees are some way away, but rotting leaves make a lot of extra work, and if we get the promised bad winter, and the pond is icy for any time, the leaves soon make the water toxic for the fish.

I try and leave my ceramic pots on bricks or feet all year, as its easy to forget as winter approaches, but if the wet soil freezes, and expands, there is quite a chance the pot will crack. Winter drainage is essential if we get lots of rain, so often it is waterlogging that kills, not the cold.

This year, to protect plants over winter, I have bought a couple of new cold frames. These are made of polycarbonate and look quite

flimsy. However, I inherited one, which lasted just about ten years. They are very cheap, but the main advantage is how easy they are to move and store away in the summer and vice-versa.

Leaves on the lawn are being mown as quickly as possible, as left, they can seriously impair it. Nearby leaves are also included, as once chopped they compost so much more quickly, making it worth getting the mower out, although the grass no longer needs a cut. Most of the bulbs are planted, and the dahlias protected. Now it is time to look at the photographs of the garden, seed catalogues, and put my feet up until next year.

Dr. Helen Czerski opens Woldingham's **Refurbished Science** Centre

On Monday 21st September, Woldingham School's refurbished Science Centre was officially opened by Guest of Honour, the physicist, oceanographer and BBC presenter, Dr. Helen Czerski. A reception in the Science Centre was held to mark the occasion, attended by the Headmistress, Governors, Senior Management Team, past and present Science staff, architects, builders, and furniture suppliers, along with the Head Girl and her Deputies.

Following the reception, Helen gave a fascinating talk to girls, parents and staff in the school's Auditorium on 'Patterns in Science'; her enthusiasm and breadth of knowledge kept the audience captivated, and the evening finished with an entertaining Question and Answer session.

The three year project commenced in summer 2014 with the refurbishment of two laboratories to trial de-

signs. Summer 2015 saw the major refurbishment phase, including four labs, staff room, preparation room, the central hall, external cladding and new windows as well as the roof-top greenhouse.

A different approach had to be given to each of the three separate sciences to ensure maximum space and appropriate usage for each discipline. In Physics, the rooms were orientated through 90 degrees to the original layout to allow for three rows of benching and a demo bench at the back.

The Chemistry lab allows for lots of group practical work. The Biology lab makes use of two sweeping curves with a moveable demo bench at the front for dissections and other demonstrations.

All labs have been upgraded with the latest touch screen whiteboards, much to the excitement of the students, and new lighting has made the spaces bright places in which to learn. The final three labs and the second prep room will be completed in summer 2016.

Oasis students organise collection for Syrian refugees

Students and staff at Oasis Academy Coulsdon have been moved by the recent news highlighting the plight of Syrian refugees fleeing their homes in fear of their safety. Youth worker, Stacey Clark, said: "We wanted to help by doing something practical and being able to provide them with clothing, shoes and warm blankets seemed like one of the most practical things we could do"



Eating Out Enjoy the South American experience at El Rancho

Review by Julia Church

A steak house may not be the first choice of restaurant for a vegetarian, but on a visit to El Rancho in Croydon Road, Caterham Valley with my partner Roger recently, I had a very enjoyable meal.

We received a friendly welcome from our waiter, Miguel, and were soon comfortably seated and enjoying the atmosphere. Roger's first impression was good, saying that it felt very nice in the contemporary surroundings and I especially liked the Latino music in the backaround.

Roger chose a tapas dish of Gambas Al Ajillo (Prawns in Garlic and Fresh Chilli) for his starter and I chose the Provoleta Argentina (Friend Provolone Cheese). I had never easten or even heard of Provolone Cheese before so I was intrigued, being a cheese enthusiast.

The cheese was different from anything I have had before, a really tasty treat that I can

kick. The generous portion was very filling, so Roger shared some of it with me to go with his spicy prawns. He agreed with me that it was a great choice of starter. At present, the menu does not feature any vegetarian main courses, so I simpy selected three vegetable side dishes for my main; the Cream Spinach, the Portobello Mushrooms and the Roasted Vegetables.

The food was presented with a flower painted onto the ,plate with sauces for decoration verv `nouveau cuisine' as a fellow diner put it! An impressive treble clef decorated Roger's steak plate, so we were highly impressed with the beautiful presentation of our food. Roger had ordered the 10oz

Ribeye with French Fries and side order of Portobello а Mushrooms. There was also a choice of an 8oz or 12oz Ribeye, and 8oz, 10oz or 12oz Rump, Sirloin and Fillet steaks on the menu at prices ranging from £12.45-£29.45

In addition to the steaks there are chicken dishes, homemade Hamburger and Beef Escalope on the menu.

Roger's steak was cooked just how he liked it and he said the flavour was very good - he had not wanted to disquise the flavour with any of the best describe as being a bit sauces on offer. I very much like Halloumi but with a spicy enjoyed my vegetarian meal,

Minus 16 degrees at dawn and the Alberta prairies are glowing amber - this is Wilderness, this horizon unbroken by human endeavour. Wild meadows and wild lakes, clean and vivid under a sky as clear as glass. There are grizzlies here, and elk that swim glacial rivers, and wolves that wander the arev mountains.

And a kitten. It's huddled on a frigid log beside a dirt track more often used by pumas. It must have been abandoned by a riding stable some miles away. It is cold, scared and in all honestly, just feels odd. Pet cat and wild nature; they don't fit.

Cats don't work well as part of English nature either. When felines meet truly wild animals, it often ends badly. We may not have pumas in Surrey to threaten our cats, but the cats themselves are a real threat to

I love cats. I helped save the life of that freezing kitten in Canada, and many others. But their toll on wildlife cannot carry on. Keeping cats inside between dusk and dawn and giving them bright-coloured collars can reduce their impact. Our wild neighbours would ask us to try.
