## Warlingham girl succeeds in cross-Channel swim

At 12,15am on Saturday 29th August, 21-year-old Emma Lister from Warlingham reached the shores of Sangatte (near Calais), completing her first solo cross-Channel swim.

Having received the call-up from her pilot late the previous evening (27th August), Emma set off from Shakespeare Beach, Dover, at 6.45am on Friday morning and, after battling strong winds and choppy seas, completed the swim 17 hrs and 39 minutes later, covering 22.5 miles.

Emma, a former pupil at Dunottar School Reigate, is currently studying at Aberdeen University for a degree in Physiology.

The idea of swimming the Channel had been a long-held ambition for Emma. However, it was following her sister's own personal battle with Ulcerative Colitis that she decided to turn this massive challenge into an opportunity to raise funds for Crohn's and Colitis. Thanks to the generosity of friends, family,

complete strangers and anonymous donations, Emma has raised an impressive £6.300.

On completing the swim, Emma said: "This has been the toughest challenge I have ever undertaken and I am ecstatic to have succeeded. There were times when I thought I was never going to make it and France didn't seem to get any closer. I hadn't anticipated such high waves and strong winds which hampered my progress, but my support team of friends and family on board the 'Sea Satin' provided muchneeded encouragement, while my mother's carefully pre-

vital nourishment throughout the swim. I am so grateful for the many messages of support and congratulations I have received and for the donations, which have far exceeded my target of £5,000 for Crohn's and Colitis."

Emma joins the elite club of less than 1,400 solo swimmers to have completed the cross-Channel swim since Captain Matthew Webb became the first recorded person to swim this stretch of

### **Community project launched** to clean St. Lawrence's War Memorial

On Saturday, 12th March 1919 the War Memorial in St. Lawrence's churchvard Caterham-on-the-Hill in was unveiled and has since been used every year for Armistice Day parade services apart from, perhaps, during World War II.

As part of the 100th anniversary commemorations of the start of WWI, local resident, Mike Homewood thought it would be fitting for the local parish to mark the occasion with a visible tribute to the men of Caterham who gave their lives.

Mike said: "No record can be found of any maintenance being carried out on the memorial during these last 96 years which is testament to the workmanship when it was constructed. There are unconfirmed reports that it may have been cleaned in the 1950's or 1980's but the memorial



now has a natural layer of algae, which has accumulated over the years. There is also a layer of fine grey soot which probably comes from passing traffic, which has dramatically increased over recent years. This has lead to a verv grey and drab structure unlike the Calvary that the parishioners of Caterham intended for their fallen." The proposal is to have the memorial professionally cleaned, not restored, to bring it back to a reasonable tone of the original Portland stone.

The original cost of the memorial, including the large oak tablets in nearby St. Mary's Church recording the names of the men who lost their lives, was £550. To raise the funds an appeal was launched in 1919 asking for donations from the people of the parish.

96 years on, an application

War Memorial Trust for a grant and if it is successful the grant will cover 50% of the cost for cleaning. Estimates vary from £2,800 to £3,500 so further funds will need to be raised to cover the 50% balance.

## Diary of a Plantaholic

With the fox digging in an effort to see his Australian cousins, the grass is quite a patchwork of re-seeded areas. I flatten the area, add some Evergreen lawn soil and then fling a small amount of grass seed on it. Earlier in the summer I had to keep it moist, but the ground is fairly damp now. If the lawn just needs repairing, or if you are planning to re-seed or re-turf it, there is still just about time, although falling leaves will need to be kept off.

I have started emptying my leaf sacks, mostly on the woodland area, as that is still the only place bare soil is evident. The double Hellebores that I planted as really small plants were absolutely beautiful after the addition of copious amounts of leafmould. Drought didn't seem to affect them.

I have cut my cherry tree back a little already. Time is running out for plums too, as late pruning now could well lead to silver leaf. I will get

Geoff to cut out a few branches of our Birch though, to let light in. This is a better time of year, as the sap is no longer rising. However it is done with trepidation, and it is always a relief to see trees that were cut back the previous year, come back into leaf. Sometimes it just has to be done though.

Warm spells of weather sees me collecting seeds. They are labelled, put into old envelopes and thoroughly dried near the boiler.

My bulbs are being potted up. As I take out the old border plants (in pots) I drop in new pots of Tulips, Daffodils, and Alliums. One hole, two seasons. They are in fresh soil, so I won't feed them until after flowering next year.

### A sad farewell to popular optician and community champion, John Rawling.

We are very sad to announce that John Rawling, grandson of the founder of Rawlings Opticians, and Ophthalmic Optician in Caterham and Purley where he worked for over 40 years, passed away peacefully on Tuesday 25th August aged 77.

John worked tirelessly in Caterham and Purley, caring for both communities with care and clinical expertise. He was also one of the first opticians to start fitting contact lenses in the late 1960s and was a Liveryman of the Worshipful Company of Spectacle Makers.

He was Councillor for Chaldon for 24 years and Chairman of Tandridge District Council twice during that time. He was heavily involved in Chaldon Village having been Chairman of the Governors of St Peter and St Paul's School and Chairman of the Trustees of Chaldon Village Hall and Le Personne Benevolent Trust amongst

other organisations. He dug the first sod for Tandridge Leisure Centre and was heavily involved in the setting up of the Douglas Brunton Centre in Caterham and the East Surrey Museum.

A passionate gardener and an expert on Rhododendrons, he was also a Camellia judge for the Royal Horticultural Society and was heavily involved in the Rhododendron, Camellia and Magnolia group of the RHS, for whom he was the editor for 13 years of their Bulletin Newsletter which was circulated all over the world to fellow enthusiasts.

A special thanksgiving service for John's life was held on Thursday 10th September at St. Mary's Church in Caterham.

### Paul cycles to raise money to support homeless people

On August Bank Holiday weekend, Paul Tillott from Caterham, a former ship broker and local gardener, joined almost 30 cyclists for a fun and challenging 200-mile sponsored cycle ride along the historic pilgrimage route of the Queen Eleanor Crosses to raise money for homeless and disadvantaged people in Central London.

The 200-mile Queen Eleanor Cycle Ride took in some of England's finest country following the route of the 12 Queen Eleanor Crosses. The route started just outside Lincoln where Queen Eleanor, King Edward I's wife, died in 1290. Her final resting place was to be in Westminster Abbey, involving a long journey to London. Edward ordered for the 12 crosses bearing statues of the Queen - the Queen Eleanor Crosses - to be erected at places where the funeral procession stopped overnight.

Many of the 12 crosses were destroyed during the English Civil War but three of the original crosses remain, in Geddington, Hardingstone (on the outskirts of Northampton) and Waltham Cross. Paul Tillott, who has been part of the bike ride for the past five

years, said: "It is a really fun ride, with cyclists keen to both soak up some of the history and also add to the £100,000 raised in previous years."

I invited my friend Julie to join me for dinner at Casa Lola Tapas Bar in Caterham Valley recently. She had never been there before as she lives in Merstham. She was surprised by the size of the restaurant and was immediately impressed by its ambience.

would have come sooner," she said. "It is so Spanishy, I feel like we are in the Costa del Caterham!"

Julie insisted on ordering a bottle of Cava to go with the Spanish meal, which was indeed the perfect accompaniment.

We decided to order a selection Tapas dishes instead of choosing from the extensive A La Carte menu. That way we could share some of the dishes and there were plenty of vegetarian choices for me.

Between us we ordered the Raxo a la Gallega (pork fillet marinated in red wine and paprika), the Gambas al Ajillo (prawns in garlic, chilli and white wine), the Champiñones al Ajillo (mushrooms with chilli

Nata (spinach with garlic, chilli and cream sauce), the Tortilla de Patatas (Spanish omelette wth potatoes and onions) and zarella, avocado and tomato salad). It worked out at anproximately £16 per head for what was, in effect, our starters and main course combined.

Julie especially enjoyed her prawns, which she said were perfectly balanced with the garlic and chilli sauce. She was also very impressed with the tortilla, which she said was one "If I had known this was here I of the best she had ever tasted.

The portions were all generous and we had a basket of bread to soak up all the lovely juices. When we had finished our meal, Julie said: "I am not hungry any more but it was so nice I want to keep on eating! So, we decided to share a Tiramisu, one of the restaurant's home-made desserts. Needless to say, our two spoons made short shrift of the deliciously creamy dessert. The restaurant was very busy
