

Flood victims express their fury towards officials for the lack of flood defence repairs

On Wednesday 13th July, an emotionally-charged meeting took place at Hillcroft Primary School in Caterham-on-the-Hill attended by scores of local people affected by the flooding on Tuesday 7th June. The meeting was organised by Caterham-on-the-Hill Parish Council and chaired by Cllr. Chris Botten, Chairman of the Parish Council. In attendance were three representatives from Surrey Highways; two from Thames Water; Louise Round, the Chief Executive of Tandridge District Council ('TDC') and Tabitha Whitcombe from the National Flood Forum charity.

After the welcome and introductions, Cllr. Botten said: "It was quite clear that afternoon in June that there was not a system in place and there was no way of knowing where the people affected by the floods were. We should have a Resilience Forum that will enable us to respond to any kind of emergency e.g. floods and power cuts."

Cllr. Botten referred to the Atkins Report on Surface Water Management in Caterham-on-the-Hill, that would help provide the data needed for a Resilience Forum. The Report had been commissioned by Surrey County Council in 2013 and completed in 2015. The comprehensive Report contains detailed surveys and photos of drainage systems in urgent need of repair, including the badly silted-up 'Money Pit', a large storm drain situated between St. Michael's Road and Banstead Road. The report also contained maps showing the areas most at risk of flooding and listed the roads where flooding was most likely.

During the meeting, members of the audience expressed their anger at the authorities for not yet repairing the drains and culverts. The representatives of Thames Water were also under fire for the failure of the sewerage system during the flood and their failure to clean up the sewerage contaminating their properties.

One of the many expressions of anger being targeted at the officials was from Park Road resident, Mary Alston, who said: "This is the fourth time in 23 years that I have been flooded. Why don't you implement the recommendations in the Atkins Report and stop passing the buck?"

Surrey Highways representative, Tor Peeble, apologised to the crowd for the lack of maintenance of the drains, saying: "The specifics of how we are to deliver the maintenance regime is being reviewed."

Louise Round also apologised for

what TDC may not have done, saying: "I am sure we could have done things better. There are clearly some big engineering solutions that need sorting out." TDC have agreed to waive council tax payments for three months for those who have had to move into temporary accommodation. However, the residents, supported by the Parish Council, are pressing for a six month break from payments, the length of time they will also be paying council tax for their temporary accommodation.

At the end of the meeting, Tabitha Whitcombe explained the benefits of forming a Flood Action Group for Caterham-onthe-Hill, to share valuable local knowledge with the authories that will help in repair work. It was agreed a follow-up meeting will be held in October so that the officials can make a progress report on the programme of repairs.

The Ray and Mary Cup for the child winning most points was won by Tabitha Wren. Judges also sampled chocolate brownies and 'My Favourite Dessert in a Wine Glass' made by hopeful entrants. Diary of a Plantaholic

"Search and Rescue" has continued through most of July. At times I needed to remind myself that summer is not yet over! Copious rainfall has meant that there has been an abundance of lush growth, and far fewer flowers than usual. To minimise the damage, I have cut lots of green leaves and shrubs back, making quite sure I'm not cutting out any potential flowers. This will help to let the light in and encourage sturdy growth and flowering. The Begonias in particular

had their gorgeous apricot flowers hidden by their leaves, which quickly put on a lovely show once some of the foliage was removed. Begonias are fairly tolerant of some shade, so do well in poor summers, especially if they are routinely fed with Tomato Feed.

I tried to feed all the later flowering plants and fruit and I'm hoping that they will soon catch up and

flowers will replace the 'lacey' look created by a never-ending supply of slugs and snails.

At the same time, I have been trying to deadhead any spoilt flowers. This is really worth doing to repeat flowering plants such as Roses and Clematis, Penstemon and Alstroemerias... Sadly some of my climbing and rambler roses will not flower until next year, so they have had a few of their old stems removed and new growth is being tied in horizontally where possible. I am already thinking of next year, but hoping that this summer will redeem itself. Whatever happens, we won't be on drought restrictions!

will continue for your lifetime unless you revoke them. LPAs can be viewed as a kind of insurance policy so that if a time comes when you need a helping hand, a structure has already been put in place.

An LPA for Financial Decisions

This can be used as soon as it has been registered with the Office of the Public Guardian. This can be used as soon as it has been registered with the Office of the public Odurhan. 

Enjoy a warm Irish welcome and first class cuisine at The Harp

What used to be The Pilgrim in Godstone Road, Caterham Valley, has recently been transformed into a smart and sophisticated bar and steakhouse called The Harp. The owners, Anthony Ryan and Aiden McDonagh, both originally from Southern Ireland, have worked tirelessly over the last few months with local suppliers and tradesmen to create a stylish, contemporary venue, complete with baby grand piano, luxury leather seating area, cocktail bar, restaurant and sun terrace.

Their friendly bar staff and top Italian chefs, brothers Paolo and Marco, all provide a service for a night to remember.

My daughter, Jenny, and I dined there on a recent warm, July evening. When we arrived there were already a number of people enjoying the sunshine outside on the terrace and a large group of ladies were sipping cocktails in the leather seating area before their meal.

Jenny and I also had a cocktail when we arrived, expertly prepared by Aiden in the traditional way (using a shaker, not an electric blender!) We then took our drinks through to the restaurant area and browsed the menu, with expert guidance from Marco.

I chose the Mac & Cheese side dish for my starter, prepared wth Cheddar, Parmesan, Mozarella, Italian Brie and Paleggio cheeses and a Bechamel sauce - a rather special Mac & Cheese with plenty of flavour. Jenny chose the King Prawns, five huge and juicy prawns in a garlic and herb sauce that she said were filling and tasted lovely.

Jenny chose the medium Sirloin Steak for her main course, which came with mushroom and tomato and she ordered the Parmesan Truffle Chips, which she had never had before, to go with the steak.

Jenny invited me to try one of the chips which had an interesting flavour, which you certainly would not want to drown in vinegar, like I usually do with chips. Jenny also ordered a serving of homemade peppercorn sauce to go with her steak, which she enjoyed very much.

I chose the vegetarian main, the Risotto, cooked with peas, mint and broad beans. It was creamy with a delicate flavour, and was very filling, especially as it came with a side-serving of fries.

The meals are prepared using top

quality, local produce and flavoured expertly with fresh herbs and spices.




