CR3 residents urged to support Plan for the future of Caterham, Chaldon and Whyteleafe

CR3 residents are being asked to comment on the first draft of the CR3 Neighbourhood Plan.

In 2011, the government introduced the right to do neighbourhood planning through the Localism Act to encourage communities to decide the future of the places where they live and work.

Thanks to the dedication and hard work of a small group of volunteers, the residents living in the CR3 postcode part of Tandridge now have the first draft of their own, detailed Neighbourhood Plan for the area ready to read and respond to.

The Neighbourhood Plan sets out the local issues and needs identified by the volunteers, who are known as the CR3 Forum, during the course of their research over the last four years. Once officially adopted, the Neighbourhood Plan will become part of Tandridge District

Council's set of policies that are used to make planning decisions in the area, giving the CR3 community a significant role in future planning and decision making for the area. The only other area of Tandridge to have produced a Neigbourhood Plan is Woldingham.

The first draft of the Neighbourhood Plan ('The Pre-submission CR3 Forum Neighbourhood Plan 2013-2035') can be viewed online at www.cr3forum.org.uk or printed versions are available at Caterham-on-the-Hill and Caterham Valley libraries.



Residents can also view supporting documents via the website, including all the data and analyses used to formulate the policies in the Neighbourhood Plan. The Site Assessments that have been carried out on the sites that have been identified for notential new housing can also be viewed on the website. The assessments show that most, if not all the sites on green belt land, are defended. CR3 Forum Steering Group member, Cllr. Geoff Duck, said: "More housing in CR3 is inevitable. We cannot tell Tandridge District Council that we do not want any more housing. Every local authority has targets set by the government that it has to meet but by having a Neighbourhood Plan, we can influence the decisions made by Tandridge District Council about where new housing will go in CR3." The CR3 Forum is holding a consultation period which ends on 31st May, where residents can express their views on issues raised in the draft Plan (Document 2: 'The Presubmission Plan' www.cr3forum.org.uk).

Comments from the consultation period will be assessed for the next revision of the Plan. The revised Plan will then be considered by Tandridge District Council, who again will publicise it for further public consultation. Finally a planning inspector will decide on whether it is ready for submission to a public referendum. It is hoped the referendum to ask local residents if they agree with the policies in the Neighbourhood Plan will take place in October or November this year. If the majority of voters say 'Yes' the Neighbourhood Plan will then become part of the set of policies that are used to make planning decisions in the area.

Residents express concern over plans for Caterham beauty spot

Residents living in the Harestone area of Caterham Valley have been voicing their concerns about plans submitted to Tandridge District Council by Caterham School regarding the future of Old Park Wood. The application is to construct two new vehicle entrances to the Wood via Gravelly Hill close to View Point. The proposed access points are to enable the removal of timber produced from thinning and coppicing operations which will produce approximately 2,400 tonnes of timber in the first ten years. HGVs will need to be able to reverse into the wood to reach the loading points and pull out again.

The concerns raised centre mainly around the damage that would be caused to the ancient woodland as a result of clearance to create the access points and the many hazards presented by the flow of HGVs along the narrow local roads to access the site.

On Wednesday 23rd March representatives of Caterham School held a meeting at the school to give local residents the opportunity to express their views about the proposed scheme.

The school has since submitted a revised planning application to Tandridge District Council (No. 2015/1819).

Robert Charlesworth, Estates Bursar at Caterham School, said: "The future of Old Park Wood was secured when Caterham School purchased the woodland in 2014, putting an end to the threat of development on this cherished spot. The School has and will continue to stay true to its aim of preserving the woods.

"To preserve this beautiful area Caterham School has consulted and employed a range of expertise to ensure a proper woodland management plan, including the Forestry Commission, Clive Ellis Woodland Management Consultancy, Surrey Highways, Surrey Wildlife, Surrey Archaeological Society and the ANOB Planning Officer.

"As a result of listening to neighbours' concerns, the School delayed its planning permission application to further refine the best routes and timings for timber removal. Once conclusions have been reached the School will once again share the information with those in the local area."



Leader of Surrey County Council, David Hodge, joins speakers at Warlingham Parish Council AGM

On Tuesday 12th April, local residents packed Warlingham Church Hall for the Warlingham Parish Council AGM.

After welcoming the audience, Chairman, David Cooley, introduced the Leader of Surrey County Council and Surrey County Councillor for Warlingham, David Hodge, to the meeting who expressed his serious concerns about the proposed Lidl development in Hamsey Green during his talk. He said: "I have looked at Lidl from a traffic point of view. Crovdon Council have managed to move the bus stop to a very unsuitable place. I am going to fight that to the last breath I have got because a lot of children use that bus stop. I am not happy and I am not prepared to see the children and people of Warlingham put at risk for a commercial venture." The next speaker, Surrey Police Area Commander, Dan Gutierrez talked about the latest crime figures and the changes being made to the police service due to austerity cuts to their budget. He also told the audience about the new Child Safeguard Investigation Scheme that has been set up following the death of Breck Bednar, who was murdered by someone he met online. Dan said the police are now scrutinising issues regarding young people a lot more and working with the Metropolitan police and other agencies to prevent similar tragedies happening again.

John Kempton, Community First Responder Team Leader, gave a presentation about the organisation to try and recruit volunteers to train to become Responders for Warlingham, Farleigh, Chelsham and Whyteleafe.

final speaker, David The Weightman, the Chairman of Tandridge District Council's Planning Policy Committee, spoke about the Local Plan. He said the council had received over 3,000 responses to the recent Local Plan Consultation which Council officers are now in the process of going through. He reassured everyone that the Council were not planning to build on the Green Belt, saying: "The Green Belt Review we undertook when creating the Local Plan is the best way to future-proof the Green Belt. We have to have arguments in our armoury as to why we are not building on the Green Belt."

The meeting ended with a summary of activities over the past year, including an update on the repair work on the War Memorial and the continued successful running of the library, with a big thank you to its volunteers. A progress report was also given on the Green Improvement Project which is currently carrying out traffic surveys before prospective schemes are put on display for the public to comment on later this year.



Schoolchildren have stars in their eyes after teacher's Space Station link up

On Thursday 14th April, staff and pupils at Hillcroft School were very proud and excited to see their Science teacher, Tom Holloway, take part in a live stream with British astronaut Major Tim Peake at the International Space Station. "He said putting together wardrobes had given him good practice at using tools and equipment and following instructions, and that was key to life in the space station environment."

With so many demands on Major Peake's time, the conversation was limited to just exchanging names, saying what school he was from and asking the question but it



Elderly residents are thanked for their memories at Parish Council AGM


Local residents were treated to a series of fascinating accounts of Caterham's past during the Caterham-on-the-Hill Parish Council AGM on Wednesday 13th April.

Parish Council Chairman, Chris Botten, explained that the main focus of the meeting would be the Oral History Project. Led by Councillor Jeremy Webster, the Oral History Project features recordings of elderly local residents sharing their memories of living and working in Caterham.

Cllr. Botten said: "It occurred to us that to allow all this knowledge of local history to pass without recording it would be an act of vandalism! The work that Jeremy has been doing is an absolutely amazing contribution to our local history and we hope that our children and grandchildren will all think: "Was it really like that in Caterham?" when they hear these recordings."

Liz Bonsall of the Bourne Society explained the context of 18 snippets from the Project to the audience.

Liz said: "Caterham has such an interesting past with the two large institutions - Caterham Barracks and the Asylum - playing a huge role in the town's heritage. They are both gone now, but these recordings can teach us all about what life used to be like

in Caterham when the Asylum and Barracks were both here. Hearing about things that happened in the past plays a huge part in helping us to understand what made Caterham the town it is today."

The snippets featured elderly residents giving accounts of well-known characters from the Asylum and the Barracks, memories of bombs falling on Caterham during the war as well as stories of happier times such as dances held in the old Tally Ho pub,

now replaced by new flats. At the end of the presentation, Councillor Botten presented certificates to some of the residents who had shared their memories of Caterham for the Project, to thank them for their contributions.





The spice garden of India

Kerala is a beautiful region in south west India and the port, Cochin, is the commercial capital. It is the he of chef, Jinson Paul, who grew up with traditional Keralan cuisine. He uses authentic Keralan cooking techniques and recipes in his kitchen at The Cochin so that diners can experience many of the region's exotic recipes for themselves.

When my daughter Jenny and I visited the Cochin recently, we both tried South Indian dishes that were completely different from what we normally ate when going out for a curry

We were recommended the Boiled Egg Roast to share for a starter where the eggs are dipped in batter, then deep fried and served with a creamy, spicy sauce, served on a banana leaf. We agreed it was a dish that we would both highly recommend

We also tried the Drumstick Soup made of lentils, shallots, ginger, garlic and curry leaves which was lovely, light and tasty starter. Jenny also had the Lamb Coconut Fry starter which had a very generous quantity of lamb and Jenny said had lots

For our main courses, Jenny had the Neerulli Prawn Curry made with King Prawns and cooked in a special sauce made with shallots. It is one of the chef's special dishes and went beautifully with our side dishes of Mushroom Masala and Beetroot with Coconut. I had a dish that is not on the menu - a Mixed Vegetable Curry that Jinson Paul prepared with a great selection of vegetables including green beans, carrots and potatoes. We shared a portion of Appam bread which is gluten free, made simply from rice and a small quantity of lentils. Nicole explained that the chef can adapt any dish to individual customer's tastes or dietary requirements, if they have a nut allergy for example, as every meal is freshly prepared once it has been ordered.

During April and May, Chez Vous restaurant in Limpsfield Road, Warlingham, are offering an amazing 2 for 1 deal on their Prix-Fixe Tuesday-Thursday menu on evenings only.

Normally £37.50 per head, the Prix-Fixe menu features a choice of three Starters, three Mains and three Desserts with optional vegetable side dishes for £3.95 each. As it is a set menu, I notified the restaurant in advance that I am a vegetarian and I was delighted to be invited to select a starter and main course from their separate Vegetarian Menu. Our friendly waitress brought us a basket of bread straight away while we decided what to order. The service continued to be excellent throughout the evening.

My son Andrew who accompanied me to the restaurant chose the Duck Confit and Poached Pears starter while I chose the Baked Brie with Redcurrant Jelly and Crouton Salad to start. In true fine dining style, both starters were beautifully presented. Andrew said the Duck

Confit had a lovely, rich flavour complimented beautifully by the sweet pears. My Brie was warm and creamy with a wonderful salad garnish.

For our main courses Andrew selected the Roasted rump of lamb, chick pea potato cake, butternut squash puree and tagine sauce. I chose the Red pesto and oven cooked tomato risotto from the Vegetarian Main Courses, as I have not had a tomato risotto before. I have had mushroom risotto plenty of times as it is one of my favourites so I thought a tomato risotto would make a nice change and I was not disappointed. The risotto was very flavoursome, enhanced by a garnish of sun-dried tomatoes and topped with some tender asparagus tips. Again, the presentation made it look almost too good to eat!

Andrew said his lamb was soft and tender and overall his meal was: "Really, really nice!" adding that he was going to bring his girlfriend to the restaurant soon because he enjoyed it so much.

For dessert I chose the Raspberry cheesecake and Andrew selected the 'Trio de Gourmandises' (three mini desserts) - apple tart, a brownie and panacotta - small, but beautiful!

Diary of a **Plantaholic**

by Sue Baines

May is a time for taking care of the spring bulbs that are over, dead heading and feeding, so they are just as good again next year.

My lovely snakeskin fritillaries have been a joy through April. Sadly they always get a visit from the lilly beetle, which lays eggs which devour them in a slimy, disgusting way. All fritillaries are vulnerable as well as lillies, even after flowering has finished. I am always on the lookout for them, however this year I have a glut of ladybirds, so have been careful not to squidge the wrong insect. Lilly beetles ,are the same colour with a longer body and no spots.

My seedlings are making lots of growth and are being moved into bigger pots. I don't prick out seedlings individually, but into small clumps which are carefully watered. They are kept shaded on sunny days, as the sun is now quite strong. Many are put

into the plastic cold frames we bought last year. The lids are kept open, unless we are due prolonged wet weather, or a frost threat-ens. This helps to "harden them off" ready for when they get planted.

Many plants have survived this winter, even the fuschias in the hanging baskets. I will remove them, looking for any evidence of vine weevil (white grubs/no roots) and give them fresh compost and long life feed, plus a trim for even growth. As they're larger they will go into a pot this year. The fuschias should look a treat with some trailing Lobelia, or Bacopa and Begonia in apricot shades.

For at least 900 years there has been a place of worship at the top of Caterham Hill but when the Caterham Railway line opened in 1856 the town's population exploded, outgrowing the ancient church of St. Lawrence, which could seat only around 60 worshippers. So in 1866 St. Mary's Church opened its doors to accommodate up to 300 of the town's faithful, just across the road from St. Lawrence's.

If you have never been inside, the building alone is well worth a visit. Nature Notes

by Adele Brand

I am looking for BAP species, by which I don't mean different types of sandwich, but UK Biodiversity Action Plan priority wildlife – those rare animals, plants and fungi for which we have a particular responsibility.

As the debate over future housing developments in Tandridge intensifies, understanding how wild species are distributed across our green belt has never been more crucial. If we don't know where they are, it is much harder to save them.

Our star UK BAP species locally is the hazel dormouse, the impossibly cute, sleepy, very shy resident of woods and hedgerows. They have been monitored in Happy Valley for some years and although most people will never see a wild dormouse, it is always worth looking out for gnawed hazelnuts. The toothmarks left behind by dormice can be distinguished from those of wood mice, voles and squirrels

with some practice.

Our rarer bat species like serotines might also be easily overlooked, but what about hedgehogs, lapwings or yellowhammers? All are threatened and we need to know where they are still surviving.
