Royal Mail scraps late collections at **Caterham's main** post boxes

On Monday 22nd August, the last collection times from the main post boxes in Caterham were changed to around 4pm, with the latest collection now being at 5pm from Morrisons in Church Walk.

Local business owner, Paul Johnston of Bourne Accountancy, has complained to Royal Mail about the changes as he says it will inconvenience many people

Roval Mail spokesperson, Sally Hopkins, said: "We can confirm that some low-use postboxes in Caterham will change the time of their final collection, with the mail picked up by

postmen and women as part of their delivery rounds. This is driven by a significant decline in letter volumes that means many postboxes no longer cover their costs. Instead of taking the step to decommission uneconomic postboxes, Royal Mail has introduced changes to its collections arrangements.

"Notices were displayed on affected boxes to give customers notification of these changes, as well as information about boxes with a later final collection time. These include business boxes, as well as those outside Post Office branches or our mail centres and delivery offices.

Angry residents sign petition against Council's introduction of recycling and waste charges

A Surrey resident has launched a petition to abolish the proposed charges being introduced at waste transfer stations in Surrey from 1st September.

Surrey County Council said the charges are being introduced because increased demand for essential services, coupled with reduced Government funding, means that the Council needs to reduce its spending in other areas, including waste recyclina.

Therefore any waste from construction, including plaster-board, bricks, soil, stones and tiles, now has to be disposed of at one of the nine Community Recycling Centres ('CRCs') listed on its website. The closest for Tandridge residents is in Earlswood. After 1st September only one bag can be disposed of per day for free. There will be a charge of £4 per bag for extra bags or part-bags, and £5 for tyres. Over 1,500 people have signed the petition that was set up by Mrs Janet Holah.

In the Petition Details, Mrs Holah says: "The new recycling

and waste charges are exorbitant and will mean that the problem of fly tipping will increase. Only being able to take one bag per day will result in people making daily trips. How environmentally friendly is that?"

Tandridge District Councillor for Caterham Valley, Alun Jones, was interviewed by BBC Surrey recently, when he explained that not only are Surrey introducing charges for disposal of certain types of waste, they are also reducing the opening hours at the Caterham and Warlingham CRCs, including the closure of the Caterham CRC every Wednesday and the Warlingham CRC every Sunday and Monday.

Cllr. Jones said: "Waste is being dumped in local parks and beauty spots because there are no longer the facilities to recycle them locally. However, Surrey County Council is not responsible for clearing it up the cost goes to Tandridge District Council and private landowners.'

Historic flypast commemorates "The Hardest Day"

On Sunday 14th August, the Battle of Britain Memorial Flight ("BBMF") took place over Kenley Airfield to commemorate The Hardest Day, on 18th August 1940.

Hundreds of spectators flocked to the airfield to watch the flypast which, organiser Mike Street said, nearly did not happen at all.

Mike said: "On the day the weather conditions were perfect and in the morning the chap from BBMF called me to let me know the flypast may arrive a few minutes earlier than scheduled. He then asked me if there was anything I wanted and I asked if the flight could come down to 300 feet. In reply he said: "300 feet it shall be!"

"However, due to operational difficulties, the Spitfire and Hurricane left Southend without enough fuel to complete their programme, which included flying on to Eastbourne after Kenley, then on to Herne Bay. Apparently the pilots were told they would have to miss out Kenley but the pilots said: "Not likely!" so they missed out Herne Bay instead. Originally they were meant to circle round and fly over Kenley three times, but in the end we were extremely lucky they came over just the once. After they arrived at Eastbourne the two fighters had to break away, leaving just the Lancaster to fly on to Herne Bay."

Diary of a Plantaholic

With summer making an appearance at last, the garden is looking gorgeous. The Dahlias in particular are making a real statement - I love them! As we are on a very windy site they are quite vulnerable to wind and rain, and do need very firm support. It also helps to minimise damage done by foxes, who like nothing better than to sit in the middle of my overflowing borders.

It isn't just slugs and snails that devour them; earwigs are particularly fond of the foliage too. They cleverly hide in the flowers, which are perfect camouflage, leaving ragged leaves in their trail. Before too much damage is done, I put an upturned flowerpot full of screwed up newspaper next to the Dahlia, which lures the earwigs out. Traditionally it is straw, but I find newspaper works fine although keeping the paper in the pot is a challenge. I save nets from fruit and vegetables, putting them over the pots and threading

"flexi-tie" through and tying them to canes, and this helps.

My runner beans are at long last giving me plenty to harvest, although I noticed they were smothered in black fly. I guess they transferred from the broad beans grown earlier in the year. I just squish them with a gloved hand, but I'm always vigilant.

Geoff has redone our top pond (the fox had torn the liner, causing it to leak). We will leave the water for a few weeks so that it is not too chlorinated when our grandchildren choose their fish. Five fish should be about right for that size pond. All that's left is to warn the aquatic centre that we're coming!



Flood victims join forces to form

On Monday 8th August, a meeting took place to form the new Caterham Hill Flood Action Group for the victims of the floods that occurred on Tuesday 7th June. Tabitha Whitcombe of the National Flood Forum attended the meeting at Hillcroft Primary School to help steer the residents through the process of setting up the Group.

Julie Blackburn, who lives in Caterham Drive in Old Coulsdon, where houses were also flooded, attended the meeting as a representative of the recentlyformed Old Coulsdon Flood Action Group.

The houses at the Caterham end of Caterham Drive were flooded by rainwater pouring down from Caterham-onthe-Hill during the storm on 7th June. Julie said: "We are very happy to have close links with the Caterham Hill Flood Action Group because many of the issues that caused the flooding on the Hill affected us too. It was not an Act of God - the agencies concerned need to

Since the inaugural meeting of the Caterham Hill Flood Action Group, the members of both groups have been putting together a list of questions to put to Surrey Highways about what they are going to do to make the drainage system fit for purpose. As heavy storms seem to be becoming a more frequent occurrence, the residents are anxious to know what Surrey Highways will do to prevent a repeat of last June's floods and whether there are any grants available to help towards the cost of repairing the infrastructure. At the end of the meeting, Park Road

resident and four-times flood victim, Mary Alston, was voted Chairman of the new Group.


Graham saw lots of changes during his 46 years at the park. He said: "There have been some changes here over the years, especially machinery-wise with all the new tractors and mowers.







Nature Notes

by Adele Brand

High summer, and tiny, curvy-winged silhouettes are flitting over lawns and churchyards, noticed in passing during the long warm evenings, but never staying still enough for a proper view.

Of all our wild neighbours, bats are amongst the most mysterious emeraina from attics and hollow trees at the hours when most of us are thinking about sleep, and calling in voices largely too high for human hearing. This year, I've been exploring Chaldon's footpaths from a new perspective - walking at dusk with a bat detector. This device converts their echolocation cries into frequencies that we can hear, and because different bats use different vocal pitches, it helps identify what species I'm watching.

Pipistrelles are easilv seen. At sundown they loop rapidly over meadows and hedgerows, hunting bugs - their appetites are formidable, and each pip can eat up to 3,000 bugs per night. We have some larger species too; serotines and noctules are monitored in Happy Valley, while brown long-eared bats emerge very late at night to pluck insects from hedgerows. the Their it is believed that they can hear the footsteps of a ladybird on a leaf.

Bats are an essential part of our ecosystems, but we are not making their lives easier. Destruction of habitat by new housing estates and intensive farming is a particularly large problem. Cats can be a problem too; keeping them indoors at night helps protect wildlife. All bats - and their roosts - are protected by law.


