Bourne Society commemorates St. Lawrence's Hospital by Liz Bonsall

On Saturday, 20th May, members of the Bourne Society local history group met to unveil their 31st Blue Plaque, part of a scheme to raise public awareness of what has gone before. Together with local councillors for Caterham and Chaldon: the Revd. Roger Lamont, former chaplain for the hospital; representatives of former employees and their families, and the owners of the selected pillar in Hambledon Road they listened to a brief history before witnessing the unveiling of the plaque by Mick Burnell.

Mick's family have lived in Caterham since the 17th century. His mother and aunt joined the hospital staff in 1913 and his father and uncles all worked at the hospital, as did Mick

Caterham Metropolitan Asylum, as it was called originally, opened its doors on 29th September, 1870 to serve the insane poor of South London, most of whom had been housed in workhouses.

By the time of its closure in 1994 there had been great

changes in the care of people with mental health/learning disabilities which resulted in many former patients being able to live more independently in the community.

Diary of a Plantaholic

With our Open Garden weekend coming up soon, there is plenty to do. Previous cold nights and occasional late frosts browned a lot of new spring foliage, which is quickly being replaced. Unfortunately our Hydrangeas, with their embryo flowers, look to have been badly hit. I am hoping that they will put on their usual lovely display, and I am feeding with tomato fertiliser. as regular applications encourage flowers (and fruit on other plants). If they have been hit, hopefully they will catch up later. I am also sprinkling Hydrangea colourant on, as I adore the blue flowers. The colourant works on only the pink and blue, not white flowers. I have mine in pots, as we have naturally alkaline (chalky) soil. In the pots is ericaceous (acid) soil. It is a good indicator of acid soil if a garden has naturally blue Hydrangea flowers. So, fingers crossed for the Hydrangeas. As for the rest of my plants, most are coming on a treat. I am hoping that my blue poppies, which are showing buds, will be in flower as I absolutely love them. They are fussy, liking shady, cool weather and

humous rich, acid soil and high rainfall. I have a corner bed where I keep all my "goodies". This year I sent off for them, although I often grow them from seed.

This bed is protected by chicken wire, as the fox managed to almost decimate the bed a few years ago. My orchids are still only half the patch they were, as they are in the same bed.

Blue seems to be the theme this year. It is such an easy colour, enhancing every plant it sits next to, whether it is a "hot" or a "cool" border, or something in between.

I hope to see you at our Open Garden weekend at 116 Burntwood Lane, Caterham from 2pm-5pm on Saturday 17th and Sunday 18th June. Entrance is £4, in aid of the League of Friends of Caterham Dene Hospital.

Eating Out

For lovers of South Indian food -"The Kerala" opens in Caterham Valley

The premises previously occupied by "The Cochin" South Indian restaurant has now re-opened under new ownership as "The Kerala", which also specialises in South Indian food.

The restaurant is named after the state of Kerala, which is situated on India's tropical Malabar Coast on the Arabian Sea, so the cuisine from the area specialises in seafood.

The kitchen team, headed by their award-winning chef, all come from Kerala and use authentic recipes from the region.

I visited the restaurant with my friend Sally recently, and while we studied the menu we tucked into some mixed snacks - a variety of tasty, crispy nibbles served with mint sauce, carrot pickle and mango pickle.

Sally ordered the Kerala Chilli Chicken for her starter - marinated pieces of chicken fried in batter with Indian shallots, which she said was a little bit hot, but not overpowering, and very flavoursome.

I ordered the Chilli Paneer homemade cottage cheese marinated with chilli and coriander power and sautéed with onion, tomato and peppers. The generous portion of paneer had a lovely texture and went well with the tangy sauce.

As the restaurant is so proud of its seafood, Sally decided to have the Mixed Sea Food Curry for her main course which came with a rich variety of seafood - King fish, squid, mussels and shell-on prawns all cooked in a special Kerala sauce. I chose a vegetarian dish, the Mushroom Koottu mushrooms stir-fried with onion and tomato and sautéed in ginger and garlic paste and exotic herbs. We shared a portion of lovely, fluffy coconut rice and a portion of Beetroot and Peas Thoran to go with our mains.

To accompany our meal we chose a crisp Pinot Grigot from their range of wines, especially selected to complement the South Indian food.

Our curries were both mild, but Nesli, who was serving us,

said that the chef can make each curry either mild, medium or hot, to suit the individual customers' tastes. Nesli said that the menu is very child-friendly because they have so many mild dishes. They also have a special menu for customers who require gluten, dairy, or nutfree choices.

Michael maintains his championship lead at Cadwell Park

Last month saw us feature local racing driver, Michael Gibbins from Caterham, who achieved a double win at the Sports 2000 race weekend at Silverstone.

On Saturday 6th and Sunday 7th May, Michael was back on the racetrack for the second time this season, this time at Cadwell Park.

Having not had the opportunity to pre-race test, Michael went into qualifying having never driven the 2.17-mile-long race circuit. A member of Michael's support team sent us the following report of his performance during the weekend: "During qualifying, Michael started off gently and began to push as he started his third lap, and he posted a respectable time, but one he knew he could improve upon in the

15-minute session. However, on his fourth lap, mechanical gremlins struck and bracket holding the gear linkage broke, resulting in Michael being unable to change gear, and retiring from qualifying after limping round in fifth gear for one more lap. At the end of the session, Michael's one and only flying lap was good enough for fifth place on the grid. This was a remarkable achievement as this was only his second ever lap of the circuit. Our team then set about repairing the car for the race the next day.

"On the Sunday, Michael took his position on the grid and got ready for the 25-minute race. He made an excellent start but the narrow track did not allow him to make any progress off the line, so he had to settle into 5th for the first corner. After a couple of laps, Michael set about making progress. By lap five, he had made his way into third place and right onto the tail

of the second place man. Despite applying sustained pressure and trying many different moves he was unable to squeeze his MCR past, so had to settle for third place.' After the race, Michael said: "It has been a bit of a frustrating weekend, but considering the very limited track time we have had, third place is still an excellent result. This championship is all about being consistent and these results are still really important, and it is encouraging that my championship lead remains intact."
