



I am even more aware of how quickly the seasons are changing this year as we have a very tight schedule for "downsizing" the garden. Geoff has almost finished paving across the back of the house and placing new fencing in position. Suddenly the garden looks enormous!! It won't for long, as we are making a start on clearing the front, and guess where all the plants from the front will be housed? We have 30 litre pots that have feet incorporated into them. However although all the pots will be removed from the front garden, I must make sure they remain on feet wherever they are, as poor drainage and cold temperatures are a recipe for winter loss.

While the soil in pots is still warm, I have been using nematodes for vine weevil. This year I may even do some pots twice, as they are being moved around a lot.

I am particularly proud of the Heucheras/Heucherellas, which have looked pristine all season, giving a lovely show of coloured leaves in the quite

shady area under the birch tree. I know from experience that these are a vine weevil favourite, along with begonias, which can look fine when put into winter storage, but if unchecked can give a home to the white grubs which increase in size as the begonia rapidly diminishes.

Before taking up and potting plants on, I am taking a few photos of the displays I am particularly fond of. Most will be integrated into the back garden. I have no idea exactly where yet, but as they are in pots it should not be too hard to decide.

Cutting back, especially in the ponds, and keeping mould at bay in the greenhouse/conservatory and emptying my leaf bags are all still to do, so it's going to be another busy month.

The Centre was also raided in November 2016, just days after it held a successful Christmas Fair to raise funds.

Bletchingley teacher sets new rowing world record!

Congratulations to Helen Hankey, Head of Music at The Hawthorns School in Bletchingley, who, alongside a team of seven others, set a new rowing world record this summer.

The eight-women team completed a relay row of 320 nautical miles along the entire south coast of the UK in a coastal double scull. Their epic challenge started in Sennen Cove in Cornwall, crossing the start line at Lands End at 5.55pm on Saturday 12th August and finished by passing North Foreland, Kent, five days, eighteen hours and twenty five minutes later, setting the new world record.

The rowers used all their skills to take their tiny 54kg, 7.5m long and 1m wide boat around some of the most challenging headlands in the UK, running tidal races off Lands End, the Lizard and Start Point and punching foul tides around St. Alban's Head and Selsey Bill.

Afterwards, Helen said: "The feat of rowing a boat around the Foot of Britain succeeded in bringing individuals with a variety of skills together to become a well-oiled team who aim to inspire others to get out there and do something exciting and different. We are normal every day people and have managed it. So, with self belief,






New memorials at St. Luke's honour Kenley Airfield's



Eating Out

Try something seasonal at Delhi Kitchen

Situated on the Limpsfield Road in Sanderstead is Delhi Kitchen, an Indian restaurant that prides itself on its seasonal menu. When I visited the restaurant recently with my mum, Pam, the Manager, Ali, said: "We change the menu very regularly to make the most of seasonal produce, and we sometimes have to explain to customers that a favourite dish they are looking for on the menu has gone out of season. They are usually very happy to try a new dish in its place."

The restaurant is bright and spacious with very large windows offering a won-

Mum chose the Sheek Kebab (minced

Mum chose the Sheek Kebab (minced lamb seasoned with aromatic spices) for her starter and I chose the Vegetable Samosas. Both starters were beautifully presented. The pastry on my samosas was nice and crispy and Mum said her kebabs were quite spicy, but not too hot.

not too hot. For our mains, I chose a selection from the Vegetable Dishes section of the menu - a Mixed Vegetable Curry, Tarka Dall (lentils and garlic) and one of the seasonal dishes, the Mistee Koduu (spicy butternut squash). Mum chose one of the chef's signature dishes, the Chicken Tikka Nahar (chicken pieces on



a skewer on a bed of spinach in a thick creamy sauce). We shared a portion of mushroom rice and the lentils and squash. We had a bottle of the house wine, a crispy Chardonnay, with our meal. Ali said they are very proud of their carefully selected wine list.

The Chef, Shaju Alom, is the owner of the restaurant, and cooked our food beautifully. Mum said that her chicken was tender, mildly-spiced and juicy, sitting on a lovely bed of spinach. She lives in Sanderstead and said she would definitely be taking advantage of their 15% off collection service soon!

Update on Alabama Rot

Over the last few years, increasing numbers of people have been asking me about Alabama Rot, more correctly called Cutaneous and Renal Glomerular Vasculopathy ("CRGV"), a disease of dogs which damages the blood vessels of the skin and kidnevs. The cause of the disease isn't known, although it is possible that it is caused by bacterial toxins. Symptoms can include redness or swelling of the extremities. Sadly, if the kidneys are affected, the mortality rate can be as high as 85%. The first thing I would like to stress is that CRGV is a very rare condition, with fewer than 100 confirmed cases nationwide in the last five years combined. Secondly, if your dog develops red or inflamed feet, it is extremely unlikely to be CRGV, and more likely to be some other form of skin disease such as an infection or

allergic skin disease. In any case, veterinary attention should be sought. Finally, CRGV does not affect humans.

My take on it is that there's little point in worrying about CRGV because at present there is no proven method of prevention. Far better to protect your dog against comparatively common, potentially fatal, and totally preventable diseases, by ensuring it is fully vaccinated and given a monthly treatment to prevent lungworm.

The National Service (RAF) Association

National Service was first introduced at the beginning of the Second World War. It continued by successive Acts of Parliament right through to 1960, with the last RAF National Service recruit being demobbed in January 1963. During this period, the world saw many conflicts in places like Korea, Suez, Cyprus, Aden and, nearer to home, the Cold War stand-off in Germany with the USSR in the 1950s.

Some 400,000 young men saw service in the RAF, receiving training in diverse trades such as electricians, engine mechanics, airframe fitters, radio, radar mechanics and operators, cooks, clerks and policemen during this time and are now in their 70s and 80s.

National Service in the RAF brought together 18 year-olds from every part of the United Kingdom and from every walk of life. Many became lifelong friends and are still in touch with each other, but many are not. If they would like to meet up with other now not-so-young lads living in this area,

We enjoy welcoming people as we know that job seeking can be a difficult and demoralising time and so there is always tea, coffee and a listening ear available. The format of our meetings is flexible, depending on the needs of the people there, but we will often look at writing or adapting CVs, interview techniques, the transferable skills that people have that could be useful in a different job altogether as well as all the different ways of finding and applying for jobs.

We have a Facebook page that advertises jobs, which can be found facebook/caterhamcommunityjobclub. From time to time we have speakers on a variety of subjects such as debt management, the benefits of volunteering, computer skills and lifestyle tips to help deal with how we feel when we are unemployed. It is often helpful to know that these feelings are a normal reaction to our situation.

Through encouragement and helpful advice, we have seen many people secure jobs and even long-term job seekers have managed to get back into work. It is very rewarding to see people regain their confidence and self-esteem. Job Club is free to attend and there is no commitment required – people can attend as and when it suits them, but one thing is sure, you will always be offered a warm welcome.
