# Caterham mourns death of popular ex-councillor, David Gosling.

Caterham-on-the-Hill Council were shocked and much saddened to learn that one of its most influential former councillors had died, suddenly, from a heart attack on Sunday 12th November. David Gosling had served as a Parish Councillor for 12 years from 2004-2016. He had been Chairman of the Council in 2008-9 and had been Chairman of the Finance and General Purposes Committee for several years. He was also a District Councillor on Tandridge District Council for the same ward, Westway ward, for eight years from 2008 until 2016.

David was very involved with all of the Parish Council's key decisions and was the 'expert' on public transport. He pushed the Parish Council to finance the extension of the hours of operation for the 541 bus service to aid residents getting to and from the railway station when

the service was cut. He was always at every parish event, quietly working in the background to ensure success.

A very private, quiet and gentle man, he always found time to help others and most residents will have seen him constantly out running as he kept himself extremely fit. He was a senior officer in the Home Office, working with the Borders Agency, and it was due to work commitments that he stood down from both councils in May 2016, although he still volunteered to help at community events.

His parents and brothers are still coming to terms with his unexpected death and the Parish Council and residents

# Concern grows over part-night street lighting in Surrey

Last January, Surrey County Council ("SCC") turned off 40,000 streetlights between midnight and 5am to save £210,000 a year following cuts in funding from central government.

Concerned that the switch-off has resulted in an increase in crime figures, Surrey residents John Lazenby and Paul Stevnberg, along with many other residents, have been bombarding the leader of SCC, Cllr. David Hodge and the other elected councillors with letters and emails demanding that the lights be turned back on. Following a disappointing response to the complaints, a Facebook campaign: "Surrey CC Put Our Streetlights Back was launched in April. which now has nearly 4,000 members (see facebook.com/groups/100802

Last October, John Lazenby launched a petition\* that has been signed by nearly 7,000 people who wish to see the streetlights switched back

7575995026).

John said: "Despite a very

obvious steep increase in crime in Surrey and Surrey Police now admitting that crime, and in particular burglary, has increased, Cllr. Hodge and Surrey Police and Crime Commissioner, Mr David Munro, continue to insist that there is no correlation between streetlights and

A Surrey County Council spokesman said: "Research carried out by Surrey Police found that when streetlights were turned off in the early hours, there was no corresponding increase in crime and when we made the tough decision to turn them off to save money because of ever-increasing demand for services, we worked with the police before making any decisions."

Following the launch of the petition, Surrev County Council have moved back the time of the switch-off from midnight to 1am.

In a recent statement to residents, the Police and Crime Commissioner, David Munro, said: "The decision

with regard to whether to switch on, or off, street lighting, is one for Surrey County Council. I have raised the issue of street lighting with the Chief Constable and other officers such as Borough Inspectors and they have told me that to date they don't consider the switch off of street lighting to be of a concern to police. In response to concerns made by residents, I additionally asked Surrey Police for a proper statistical analysis of the issue and that was provided to me and is public (www.surreypcc.gov.uk/2017/11/street-lighting-report-november-2017/).

"In response to comments from residents made on that

analysis, I have asked for a further report on any correlation. This is awaited and I will make it public once I have received it. At all times I have followed the evidence which up to now has failed to provide a link between the switch-off and increasing crime. If there is evidence that changes this view then of course we will consider this."

Mr Munro added that the new

report, when completed, will be passed to SCC so they can decide whether it affects their decisions on street lighting.

Any new evidence and a link to the new report will also be published in The Caterham and District Independent and The Warlingham and District Independent.

## Rose and Young a Compulsory Purchase Order is now "unnecessary"

On Tuesday 12th December, a report by Tandridge District Council's Chief Planning Officer, Piers Mason, was submitted to the Council's Resources Committee to update them about the progress towards the development of the derelict Rose & Young site in Croydon Road, Caterham.

The Council had withdrawn its Compulsory Purchase Order ("CPO") for the site at the end of August because the purchasers of the site, Clarion Homes, had confirmed they were close to exchanging contracts with the

site's owners, Caterham Properties Ltd.

Mr Mason's report stated that contracts have now been exchanged and the Council's legal advisors considered that a possible CPO action was now unnecessary.

Following the meeting, spokesman for Tandridge District Council said: "We have been liaising closely with the owner and the purchaser of the former Rose and Young site and both are very keen to complete the sale as soon as possible. The purchaser has work in place to allow them to complete the sale in late January/early February. The Council has maintained its position that if progress does not continue to be made it will again use its CPO powers."



# Councillors work crossparty in support of local schools




