Council launches first community lottery in Surrey

On Wednesday 31st January, over 100 quests attended the official launch of the Tandridge Together Lottery at The Orpheus Centre in Godstone.

Local celebrity and trustee, Sir Richard Stilgoe, welcomed everyone to The Orpheus Centre, before the assembly watched students perform. Chairman of the Council, Cllr. Gill Black, opened the event and Ben Speare from lottery provider Gatherwell, explained how the lottery will work. Lottery tickets costing £1

went on sale on Thursday 22nd February, Anyone buying a ticket will be able to select the cause they want to support from those registered on the website. The first weekly draw will be on 31st March with a chance to win £25,000, as well as a special additional prize of £250 worth of Amazon vouchers donated by local business Butler & Young Associates. 50p of the £1 ticket price will


go directly to the chosen good cause. A further 10p in every pound will go into a fund for

the Council to distribute in the form of small grants, to a wide range of good cause projects who apply for support in the Tandridge district. The rest will go towards prizes and administration costs. There is no cost to the charities, projects and groups who sign up. Councillor Simon Ainsworth, Chair of the Resources Committee, said: "It was wonderful to see so many local good causes represented at the lottery launch event. 

Masterplan moves a step closer to town centre regeneration

Tandridge District Council would like to thank everyone who took part in the consultation about proposals for the future of Caterham and viewed the Draft Caterham Town Masterplan Supplementary Planning Document. The consultation ran for eight weeks and finished on Monday 22nd January.

The proposals were viewed by 2,466 people on the Caterham Masterplan website and over 200 people attended one of three exhibition events held during the consultation. The Council is still analysing the feedback, which will be used to create the final Caterham Town Masterplan Supplementary Planning Document, expected to be adopted in the spring. The feedback and comments will be published and available to view shortly at www.caterham-masterplan.org.uk.

Councillor Michael Cooper, Chairman of the Caterham Town Working Group, said: "We are continuing to meet with stakeholders to discuss implementation plans and will continue to work closely with all our partners to ensure we deliver a comprehensive and timely regeneration programme, which will create a stronger economy and more local jobs."

Last stop for weekend trains to London Victoria

This May sees the end of the line for direct trains from Caterham to London Victoria at weekends. Govia Thameslink Railway (GTR) has announced. The changes are part of the Railplan 20/20 programme to reorganise timetables, frequency of trains and infrastructure, which will also involve Whyteleafe South, Whyteleafe and Kenley stations. A three-phased consultation, beginning in September 2016, contacted 100 local community groups, including the East Surrey Transport Committee, and gave commuters the chance to give feedback.

A spokesman for GTR said: "Our research shows that there is little demand for the slow direct service to Victoria, so we are proposing to take the opportunity, created by the Thameslink programme, to replace this with two fast trains every hour to

London Bridge.

"These will take about 30 minutes, compared with Victoria trains that take over 50 minutes. Passengers for Victoria would be able to change at Purley or East Croydon as most do already."

Clir Alun Jones does not believe the changes were explicit or publicised enough. He said: "The consultation is nonsense. The website is not very clear it has not been communicated particularly well and most of the commuters I have spoken to on the trains weren't aware that a consultation had taken place.

"They (GTR) have not contacted Caterham Valley Parish Council at all, and as a District Councillor I have had no contact with them either, so I am not sure who these community groups they contacted are." For more information on the changes visit: www.railplan2020.com.

Chaldon sadly lost one of its prominent residents when Phil Saville lost his fight against cancer in January.

Phil started Chaldon Creakers, a local running group that has never missed a run on Wednesdays since its formation in 2003.

For over 30 years Phil had been participating in sports events, having fun and raising money for many charities. His sons joined him in the early years on many sponsored walks, cycle rides, runs and swimathons.

Phil completed five London marathons, raising significant funds for charities and when he wasn't running he was marshalling. Phil was a member of Oxted Runners for over 20 years and completed the East Grinstead triathlon. His last swimathon was last April, when he swam 200 lengths of Doynings for Marie Curie. He was also a regular on the London to Brighton cycle rides, raising more funds for charities.

Phil was a very hard working and efficient secretary to the charity Caterham Overseas Aid Trust (COAT) for over 12

years, following many years on the Committee of the Friends of the Earth. He introduced the very popular Bedrock concerts and masterminded their 25th anniversary at de Stafford School. Phil will be remembered as a very welcoming and caring person who always encouraged everyone to think of others through sport, charity work or social events. Phil had a lot of fun and raised significant money for charity throughout his life and is still now continuing to raise money for cancer research via






