Elderly express their anger over proposals for Douglas Brunton Centre

by Julia Church

Members and Friends of Caterham's Douglas Brunton Centre for the elderly ("DBC") have been protesting about Tandridge District Council's proposals to relocate it's popular day centre services. The DBC currently provides affordable hot lunches, exercise classes, podiatry, hairdressing and social activities to many elderly and lonely people who benefit from these essential services all being provided under one roof.

In a recent statement, Tandridge District Council said: "On 21st June the Housing Committee agreed to look at

the option of leasing a large part of the DBC in Caterham to St. Catherine's Hospice. If part of the building is leased to the hospice, several new services will be available and there will be changes to existing services, some of which will move to alternative near-by locations. The centre is not closing, there are no plans for inpatient facilities to be provided by the hospice and no plans to convert the centre to solely office use or homes.

"It costs the Council around £250,000 a year to run the centre and the number of

people using it has steadily declined.

"The Council will work with local groups that organise lunch clubs, exercise and arts and crafts groups, to find out what's currently available locally and what the potential is. Services provided by Surrey Choices, Age UK, East Surrey Dial-a-Ride and the Men in Sheds project will stay at the DBC"

Councillor Geoff Duck, Chair of the DBC steering committee, said: "I know people are concerned about possible changes, but we are doing all we can to find out about alternatives locally, as well as find ways to support those who need services the most."

Housing Committee, said: "It is early days and we are exploring the possibilities. We appreciate this has made a number of older people very anxious and they are concerned about whether activities will continue and where they might be located. This is a piece of research we are currently undertaking and we need to talk to a number of local organisations to see what is possible."

The Chairman of Caterham-on-the-Hill Parish Council, Cllr. Jeremy Webster, has written a letter regarding the proposals to Cllr. Martin Fisher, the Leader of Tandridge District Council and Chairman of the Council's Well Being Board.

In the letter, Jeremy says: "We are worried that the service users at the DBC have been left in a state of upset by the way that the current announcements about its future have been handled. Requiring certainty, they have instead been left in confusion. Given our knowledge of the needs of older people, this is not in our view, very good management practice.

"We also note a comment in the Local Plan which brackets the DBC together with the nearby waste disposal site and another site in Warlingham as the possible location of 150 dwellings, under the "North Tandridge One Public Estate" project.

day centre for older people is lost it will never be replaced.

"To the best of our knowledge, no Councillor Nick Childs, Chair of the analysis has been done to justify the longer-term impacts of what is proposed, besides an ad hoc review of where service users might go to have meals or other services currently offered by the DBC. This, in our view, renders the current direction of travel to closure of the Day Centre at the DBC quite premature. Mambers of the Day Centre say that the recent decline in numbers attending the centre is due to them feeling "squeezed out" by space being taken over by Surrey Choices. Pensioner, Mrs Katie Krunch, who is a member of the DBC, has started a petition against the relocation of the day centre services.

Katie said: "We would be so devastated if the services at the DBC are discontinued, as for many elderly residents their visits to the centre are their only contact with the outside world. Everything is in one place here, which is so important for the many members who get here on the Dial-a-Ride buses, then have a hot meal, get their feet done, etc. Some of them are completely immobile and apart from their carer's visit at home, they wouldn't see anyone at all if they did not come to the

Caterham councillors express their fears over Draft Local Plan

As the six week consultation on the Draft Local Plan is nearing its close, Tandridge District Council is urging people who have not yet done so to get involved and have their say. The consultation is an opportunity for residents to comment on the legal compliance and soundness of the plan.

Tandridge District Councillor for Caterham Valley, Cllr. Alun Janes, said: The Draft Local Plan is underpinned by an increase in density in huge parts of Caterham Valley, Caterham Hill and Whyteleafe. It moves densities from 55 dwellings per hectare up to 100 dwellings pre hectare. Whilst there are no sites identified, my fear is this will open up parcels of land as windfall sites. This is what happened in the past and my fear is this is what the plan will allow in the future."

Cllr. Jeremy Webster, Chairman of Caterham-on-the-Hill Parish Council, said: "We are disappointed to note that despite our hopes that the Local Plan would mean a farier distribution of development across the District, yet again Ceterham-on-the-Hill is to have even more development, including on a Green Belt site in a Conservation Area, namely the site at Victor Beamish Avenue adjacent to Kenley Airfield. No affordable housing is planned for Oxted, and the infrastructure promised in the plan for Caterham Hill is inadequate, and again fails to address flood risk, health appointments and school places. We are therefore very disappointed and urge concerned residents to respond to the Consultation, which is open until 10th September."

Councillor Keith Jecks, Chair of the Planning Policy Committee, said: "This is the last opportunity for residents and other stakeholders to comment on the plan before it is presented to a government appointed planning inspector. There is plenty of information about the plan on the Council's website and I encourage everyone to read the guide for submitting comments. Unlike earlier consultations which considered alternative options, Regulation 19 is solely concerned with the legal compliance and soundness of the draft plan. But all comments received will be made available to the inspector, so please do take part."

For the more challenging, reformed GCSEs, over a third of all results were the top grade 9 and over 80 per cent of all GCSE results were graded A*-A or equivalent grade on the new numeric scale. 50 pupils each achieved eight or more grade 9s or A*s in their results - a new record for Caterham School.

Girls at Woldingham School have excelled in the new qualifications for the second year running. 15 girls achieved an outstanding nine or more A*/9-8 grades and five achieved straight A*/9-8 grades.







When we arrived we were quickly served popadoms and our drinks order was taken while we checked out the menu, and the restaurant was soon buzzing with lots of other customers.

Helen chose the Chicken Chat for her starter and I opted for the Garlic Mushroom. Helen said her chicken starter was lovely, infused with spices, making it very flavoursome, as were my juicy garlic mushrooms. We were both pleased with the generous-size portions.

For our main courses, Malek, the owner of the restaurant, recommended Balti Vegetable as a good vegetarian option for me, while Helen chose the Lamb Tikka Masala. We also ordered a portion of Lemon Rice and Sag Aloo to share and my dish came with naan bread, which we also shared. We chose a Mateus Rosé wine to go with our meal perfect!

The Balti Vegetable made a nice change from the creamy Vagetable Pasanda I normally choose, and had quite a spicy kick to it, but not too hot.

Helen said it was the first time she had tried Lamb Tikka Masala as she normally has chicken, and the lamb was nice and tender, with the sauce setting it off really well. The rice was very delicately flavoured with lemon and not at all over-powering. "The Bentley Experience" - living the dream!

On Friday 24th August my son Andrew and I were invited by H.R. Owen Bentley Surrey in Weybridge to test drive the new Bentley products, including the luxurious 626bhp Bentley Continental GT.

We were also given the opportunity to try out the most advanced Bentley ever - the Bentayga SUV and were chauffeur-driven in the "pinnacle of Bentley excellence" the Mulsanne Speed.

The showroom was situated close to the A3 dual carriage-way which was where we took the cars to get a taste of how they felt to drive, and luckily it was a lovely sunny day.

Our first drive was in the Bentayga, the "fastest, most powerful, most luxurious and most exclusive SUV in the world".

As we pulled into a layby to swap drivers, I noticed large potholes looming, but was reassured they would not pose a problem to the Bentayga, with its off-road capabilities. Sure enough, as the car went straight over the deep potholes we did not notice a thing! We were told the car can climb up 30% gravel hills, through snow at minus 35 degrees and sail through water half a meter deep with ease, as the height of the car can be raised.

On the A3 we switched from Bentley driving mode to Sport mode to sharpen up the response. The head-up display was useful - with the overthree-ton car getting up to speed so effortlessly, it is easy to break the speed limit and get caught out.

Next up was the new Continental GT, the two door, four seat Grand Tourer. Its sporty 6 litre twin-turbocharged V12 engine and top speed of 185 mph made it quite tricky to stay at 30mph on the side streets. However, once out on the A3, we could get a real feel for the incredible power under the bonnet as the car roared up to speed. When Andrew was behind the wheel I could really appreciate the superb interior, which even includes rotating display switches giving you the old-style dashboard complete with knobs to twiddle, instead of the contemporary version, depending on your mood.

The last drive of the day was by chauffeur in the exquisitely luxurious Mulsanne Speed, that has a 6¾ litre twin-turbo V8 engine and top speed of 190mph. The Mulsanne Speed is Bentley's premium VIP executive car usually purchased by customers who have a chauffeur to drive them around, although the specification says it has been created with driving satisfaction for those who prefer to take the wheel themselves.

Chris, our chauffeur, said: "This is a big, heavy vehicle but it is certainly no slouch!" He said the car is the top end of luxury cars, steps above the S-Class Mercedes, retailing at £230,000 upwards. Andrew and I felt like royalty as we experienced "the world's most refined ride" in ultimate comfort. A huge number of man-hours go into creating the wonderful interiors of the cars. The beautiful walnut panelling in the doors matched perfectly, and Bentley keep stocks of the wood so that any replacements that may be required will have identical markings to the original. 




Charity golf day raises over £6,000 in memory of little **Harry Gaut**

Diary of a **Plantaholic**

by Sue Baines

Although the rain towards the end of July was really welcome, the accompanying wind was devastating, despite all Geoff's supports. The Dahlias in particular with their fragile hollow stems put up no resistance, neither did the wonderful Hydrangea Annabelle. I always try to "go with the flow", so the Dahlias were tidied up and lots of nearby plants were also trimmed back, allowing them to re-flower. Sadly the Hydrangea flowers were not retrievable. Cutting back then, has meant that, despite the drought, the borders are looking reasonably fresh. Most of the dead brown stems of the early hardy annuals have been removed and their seed re-sown. They are already making sturdy little plants, and the new meadow area is also looking quite promising too. The other source of fresh growth are the "Chelsea chopped" Sedums (so-called as that was the time they were cut back.)

The "Frosty Morn" with its variegated leaves looks particularly good, as does the "Gooseberry Fool" which adds texture. Cutting them back has made them nice and sturdy too.

Complementing the flowering border throughout, has been the grasses. The superb "Stipa Gigantea" with its towering golden oats, untouched by wind, has been the most wonderful focal point for months, and the "Arundo Donax" has had its best ever year with its 6' magnificent thick golden variegated leaves. Although the garden is looking better than I had expected, my thoughts are now on next season. I've made a good start on taking cuttings, which are in troughs of new multi-purpose soil mixed with perlite. These are kept damp and in a shady place, going into the propagators when the weather is cool and dull to prevent mould.

With Autumn almost upon us cleanliness, ventilation and light are going to become more important and watering much less of a chore, which I am rather glad about this year!

The affordable homes are expected to be ready by winter 2020 and will be available to purchase through shared ownership (part rent, part buy) aimed at first time buyers. Purchasers will buy part of the home and pay rent on the rest.
